Roosevelt's Teddy Bear

Supplies:

- A hand towel
- 3 rubber bands
- Ribbon
- 2 buttons
- 2 googly eyes
- A hot glue gun

Steps:

Step 1: Lay the hand towel down horizontally on a table. Roll the towel up from the bottom to the halfway mark, then roll the towel down from the top down until both rolls meet in the middle.
Step 2: Grab the ends of the towel. Fold them in to meet each other with a slight twist, making sure that the rolled parts of the towel are facing out. The top rolls should be a little shorter than the bottom rolls. The top rolls will be the teddy bear's arms.
Step 3: Slightly pull the rolled arms out to the sides.
Step 4: Gently move the top of the left roll inward to form the teddy bear's round head.



Step 5: Tie a rubber band around the neck.
Step 6: Take the corners of the bear's head and squish them to make the ears. Tie a rubber band around each ear.
Step 7: Smooth down the bear's face and glue down two googly eyes, a button nose, and a button onto the bear's chest. Finally, tie a ribbon around the bear's neck for its tie.
