Clifton G. Webb: On the Shoulders of Ancestors

Using his own visual alphabet developed over decades, New Orleans-based artist Clifton Webb's work is imbued with reverence and dignity.

Webb's work proclaims: "This is me and all the people around me who don't get to see themselves; who don't get to see the royalty and sacredness of who the African American is." Webb grew up in the Jim Crow South in a loving, nurturing, and caring community. He came to realize the people who made up that community were vastly under-represented in artistic images. He asked himself, "What makes me unique? How do I make a mark that would suggest something about me, an African American?"

Webb's work is included in the permanent collections of the Ogden and the New Orleans Museum of Art and is also an arts educator with a BFA and an MFA in sculpture from Louisiana State University.

The work will be on display until July.

An operetta for Bloomsday

On the evening of June 16th, 1904, James Joyce went out for a walk with his future wife Nora Barnacle on their first date and changed the course of his life, literature, law and culture. The date of their first outing was later memorialized in Joyce's Ulysses, the peripatetic novel that tracks Leopold Bloom through the maze of Dublin streets. As part of the 2019 New Orleans' observance of Bloomsday, the annual celebration of Ulysses, we will present the world premiere of Jonathan Freilich's new operetta based on salacious letters Joyce wrote to Nora and features projections from world-renowned photographer David Gamble. The operetta is 45 minutes long.

Tickets are \$8 at the door and the booth will open 45 minutes before the show.

The Short Dark Long Run

An overnight improvised performance while the sun stands still.

An exercise in artistic duty, devotion, pattern-disruption, duration, and transformation, twenty artists mark the solstice with an open improvised performance during the exact hours and minutes of nighttime. Organized by choreographer Shannon Stewart (SCREAMING TRAPS) in conjunction with musician/composer Byron Asher and a slew of New Orleans dancers and musicians, in The Short Dark Long Run, participating artists commit to improvising from astronomical twilight to sunrise.
