

Biodiversity policy

REMA 1000 wishes to reduce the negative impacts our consumption and production of groceries have on the earth's biodiversity. Here, we particularly want to pursue a policy that protects biodiversity in rainforests and in the ocean, where we know that biodiversity is particularly fragile and under great pressure these years.

REMA 1000 commits to

- Continuously seeking to reduce our negative impact and increase our positive impact on biodiversity throughout our value chain by mapping risks in our value chain as well as developing policies and action plans on particularly critical ingredients and areas (see our deforestation policy, responsible and sustainable palm oil policy, and responsible and sustainable soy policy).
- Ensuring that we offer a sustainable fish assortment that is caught with respect and care for nature or farmed sustainably, and to deal solely with serious suppliers that can document their fishing method and area as well as the Latin name of the fish.
- Entering strategic partnerships with other actors working towards a grocery trade with a smaller footprint on biodiversity.
- Expanding our product portfolio of goods with recognised labels such as the RSPO for palm oil, RTRS for soy, FSC for wood products, MSC and ASC for fish products, and Rainforest Alliance certifications for tropic products.
- Making free land more nature-friendly land where possible and increasing the range of products focusing on biodiversity in our stores.
- Reporting annually on our progress in our work to ensure better biodiversity.
