Communion - ReEntry Retreat

Passage: 1 John 1:1-4

Place: El Kanah, Re-entry Retreat

Date: 22 Sep 2019

Intro:

- In front of us are reminders that Jesus our saviour was a man of sorrows, a man of suffering.
 - Not senseless suffering, but driven by love and his decision to save us.
- Let's start off by singing about our saviour who suffered.

Song:

Man of Sorrows

Reading:

• 1 John 1:1-4

Reflection:

- That's a really **special** thing that we just read:
 - that "we have **fellowship** together, and that: "our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son."
- What is fellowship?
 - The word means <u>sharing</u>: sharing <u>life</u>, sharing a <u>purpose</u>, even sharing <u>resources</u>.
 - So it's pretty amazing that we have **fellowship** with the Father and Son.
 - Between us and God the sharing scales are certainly not balanced equally: God shares with us far more than we could ever share with him.
 - All we can do is say "thankyou!"
- Of course fellowship with Jesus is not always easy: we have here symbols of his <u>suffering</u>, and sometimes fellowship with Jesus is the fellowship of suffering.
 - · You know that.
 - But remember suffering with Jesus, also comes with the promise of **shared glory** through the power of his resurrection. (cf. Phil 3:10).

- The <u>Lord's Supper</u> is described as... well my bible says: a "participation" in the body of Christ, but it's that same word: fellowship, sharing.
 - Here is a signpost, a recognition of the fellowship with God that we have by faith through the death of Christ.
- And the fact that we are about to eat <u>together</u>, is a recognition that in Christ we have fellowship with each other.
 - We came together this weekend, mostly as strangers:
 - from different places,
 - with different personalities,
 - · different stages of life,
 - different church backgrounds,
 - but I hope we've recognise that we share a common identity.
 - We have experienced fellowship.
 - It's a **special** thing.
 - Of course one of the particular things we have in common is a passion for mission.
 - And we're grappling in slightly different ways with the fact that today our part in Gods mission is not what it was.
 - But, you know what?
 - Right here is a reminder that there is more to us and our identity before God than what we do on his mission.
 - Because this supper is a reminder that one day the mission of reaching the lost will reach its conclusion,
 - Whereas fellowship with God and with each other will continue into eternity.
- On that day this supper will become a **feast**; and our fellowship with Jesus will be **face to face**.

Prayer:

- Heavenly Father, what a privilege to have fellowship with you and with your Son.
- · What grace that you would want anything to do with us!
- · We don't deserve it!
- · We confess the we are sinners:
 - · We confess sinful actions,
 - Sinful thoughts,

- · Sinful desires,
- · We confess that there's likely sin that we aren't even aware of.
- Yet Lord, you are gracious!
 - Please assure us again of the complete cleansing that comes through Christ and his death on the cross for us.
 - · Renew our joy and our thankfulness,
- · We ask in Jesus name, Amen

Supper:

And so, it was our Lord Jesus, on the same night he was betrayed who **broke bread** and said: "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

I'll pass it round, you can break off a piece, and then we'll all wait an eat together.

Jesus also said: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you."
