

Off Licence

Section 17 to 20, 64 and 135, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **General Distributors Limited** (the licensee) is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol on or from the premises situated at **K012/80 St Lukes Road Mount Albert Auckland**, and known as **Woolworths St Lukes**, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold on or delivered from the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) Alcohol may be sold only while the premises are operating as a grocery store and only during the following days and hours:
Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 9.00pm
- (c) Drinking water is to be freely available to customers immediately adjacent to any alcohol that is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- (d) No alcohol may be sold other than—
 - (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
 - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
 - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (e) No intoxicated persons may be allowed to enter or to remain on the premises.
- (f) Ensure that appropriate signs are prominently displayed detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons and are easily read from each point of sale.
- (g) Only the area delineated on the plan dated 10 April 2025 is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol. A copy of the plan must be either displayed alongside this licence, or available for viewing at the premises upon request.
- (h) The whole of the premises is undesignated.
- (i) The licensed premises are more precisely identified as outlined in the plan date stamped as received by Auckland Council on 10 April 2025.
- (j) Incident register: The licensee must continue to record alcohol related incidents using existing systems, ensuring flexibility to avoid duplicative processes.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licenses, this licence continues in force—

- (a) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed.

This licence expires at the close of 2 June 2028 unless renewed.
