Land Rights and Gender Responsive Climate Action

Background

Land is the common thread among climate change mitigation and adaptation, ecosystem restoration, as well as biodiversity conservation.

Land and its natural resources are fundamental to lives and livelihoods, making equal access to and control over land vital to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.

Even though land is a finite resource, the pressures exerted on it seem to be without end. Natural climate solutions, land restoration, and biodiversity protection involve vast land use changes globally, posing significant challenges to the people living on such lands. Recognizing and protecting legitimate tenure rights, including customary rights, is a critical step to safeguard human rights, realize gender equality, and leave no one behind.

The Strategy Workshop on Women's Land Rights and the Rio Conventions, held in Berlin in July 2023, shed light on both challenges and

opportunities for empowering women's land rights and advancing the land rights agenda across the three Rio Conventions. An important pillar in this context is the work of the Conventions' National Focal Points (NFPs). However, the overall alignment and coordination of their work is often complicated by institutional silos, a lack of coordination mechanisms, differences in terminology, and a complex structure of focal points within and across the Conventions.

Participants of the strategy workshop emphasized the need for more transparent communication and coordination between NFPs and other designated focal points. Fostering cooperation between the Conventions' focal points is critical to safeguarding women's land rights and harnessing the synergies among national climate action, sustainable land management and biodiversity conservation.

Seminar Overview and Objective

Building on the insights of the strategy workshop, TMG Research is organizing a seminar during the Africa Climate Week. The seminar discusses both challenges and opportunities as perceived by National Focal Points and Gender Focal Points in their efforts to bridge between the Conventions and national implementation. Through an open discussion among designated focal points and other stakeholders, the seminar further aims to identify existing synergies and strengthen partnerships on the ground to secure and advance women's land rights for sustainable and climate-resilient landscapes.

Objectives:

O1. Identify Needs and Find Synergies: Reflect on the challenges faced by the Conventions' focal points in coordinating their work and explore collaboration opportunities to secure women's land rights and protect the legitimate tenure rights of local communities in the context of national climate action and land restoration efforts.

O2. Facilitate Global-Local Dialogue: Discuss measures to support focal points in their efforts to inform international processes with local perspectives on land tenure issues and consider pathways to ensure that local voices are represented and heard at global climate change discussions (Gegenstromprinzip).

03. Partnerships and Advocacy for Land Rights:

Sketch existing partnership opportunities and determine champions of change to advance the land rights agenda across the Rio Conventions and global climate action, following the Africa Climate Week and leading up to COP28.
