Congratulations to Maisie Symonds, Nikita Parris and Fran Kirby for their call-up to the Lionesses squad this week. Of course, Nikita and Fran have lots of experience of the England set-up and I am sure they will offer lots of advice and tips to Maisie.

I know she was surprised to get the phone call from Sarina Wiegman this week but it is well deserved and I hope all three, and the rest of the girls going on international duty next week, relish the experience and do themselves, their families and the club proud.

Since our last game at home against Chelsea at the start of the month we've had mixed experiences on the road. It was great to get back to winning ways away from home against Spurs. Defensively we were organised all over the pitch and we had the chances to add to Fran's goal. I thought we were good value for the three points.

Last Sunday at Leicester City our first-half performance fell well below the standards I expect of the players and they demand of themselves. We defended really poorly and left ourselves with a lot to do 3-0 down at half-time. We were much more like ourselves in the second half and after pulling two goals back we had a couple of opportunities to draw level. But the damage was done and if we have learned one thing it's that we have to maintain our standards on and off the ball regardless of who the opponent is, from minute one to minute 90 and beyond.

In both games we had great support from our fans which we appreciate and it is great to see increasing numbers travelling to follow the team away from home.

We will certainly need to be at our best today and our fans can play their part. We've made the Broadfield Stadium a really tough place for visiting teams this season and that's thanks to the tremendous support we receive. Against one of the best teams in the WSL we will need you all again so make sure you give the players all your encouragement and backing.





SYMONDS STUNNED BY ENGLAND CALL

Congratulations to midfielder Maisie Symonds who has been called up to the England senior squad for the first time

The midfielder joins Albion teammates Nikita Parris and Fran Kirby in Sarina Wiegman's squad for England's Nations League double-header against Belgium next month.

Maisie has played for England at all age groups and the 22-year-old is Albion's longest-serving player, having made 70 appearances for the club since her debut in the 2020/21 season.

Maisie said, "When I found out I was a bit stunned to be honest – it was a bit surprise but a really nice one and a bit overwhelming! When Sarina first called it was an unknown number, so I thought at first it was a scam, then we spoke and she asked me to come to the next camp and I cried and cried and then when I spoke to my mum and dad and brothers and sisters they were crying too!"

"But I'm really looking forward to showing what I can do, and it will be great to have Keets and Fran there as well. They've already explained to me what to expect and it will be great to meet the rest of the girls. Everyone is buzzing for me and that's such a nice feeling as well."

THERE'S SOMETHING ABOUT MARIA

... AND HER SOULMATE THEO!

Defender Maria Thorisdottir says this season has been a 'joy' but there is still a lot to fight for in the remaining weeks of the WSL season

This is your second season with the club, Maria, so how does it compare to the previous one?

We've managed to get back into our rhythm again, especially the game against Chelsea, and the way we're playing is very enjoyable. I love it. It's the way I like to play. Compared to last season, this season has been a joy. I've been in the game for a long time and I know there's always going to be dips. It's just the way you handle it. That's why I love playing football because teams need to solve problems together and when you succeed, and you know you've done something right, you learn a lot from it. Next time we have a dip we will know how to deal with it better, so it won't last as long.

As a squad you must have been pleased with the last home performance against Chelsea?

We had a national break before where some people went away and some people got a bit of time to switch off and I think that did us good. We came back and we just cracked on against Chelsea and I think that performance was one of the best in my time here. We followed up against Spurs, which was a different type of performance because we had to dig in, and it's a shame we couldn't get something at Leicester

last Sunday, especially after our second-half fightback.

You have played at clubs like Chelsea and Manchester United where there was an expectation to win. Is that what we're trying to develop here?

We don't have that same pressure, so you can always surprise teams, and I think that's what we've done this season. We brought a lot of new players in during the summer, but we quickly got some momentum and we've taken points off some of the top teams at home, like Chelsea and United, which is very satisfying. We haven't quite had that consistency in the second half of the season, but there are still enough games left to have a strong finish, and we're still unbeaten at home, which is a record we want to try to maintain.

Enough about football. How's your dog Theo and how does he feel about becoming the unofficial team mascot?

I think he loves it! It looks like he's got a lot of confidence at the moment because he's running up to people on the street saying hi! It feels like he's taking the role seriously.



It must be nice in a business like football where you go from club to club to be able to take your best friend with you?

I've always called him my soulmate and he's definitely my psychologist. It's always nice to come home after you have lost a game or had a bad training session to someone who's always happy to see you.

He's been to the Amex, and I just wish I could bring him in every day. He would be such

a good addition to the team, bringing joy! He's never upset; he just enjoys life so much. Sometimes I think 'what's going on in your head' because he seems so happy and gives me and people who meet him good feelings as well. I live near the beach and when he's pulling on the lead I can tell how happy he is and it makes me feel good as well.

Back to the football and another tough test against Manchester City today.

We played well there earlier in the season and were a bit unlucky to lose 1-0. They have obviously had a hard run of games against Chelsea in the last fortnight, but they have got a strong squad and they always make it tough for us. But we're proud of our home form and want it to continue. The fans have been brilliant this season, here and away where we seem to have more supporters each week. It should be a really good game and one we're looking forward to.

MANCHESTER CITY

City arrive at the Broadfield Stadium looking for points to keep their challenge for a top-three finish alive after another route into the Champions League closed on Thursday

City took a 2-0 lead into the second leg of their quarter-final against Chelsea at Stamford Bridge, but their injury-ravaged side were 3-0 down at the break and Chelsea rarely looked like relinquishing their advantage in the second

half as they sealed a 3-2 aggregate win.

Such are their injury worries, City could only name four outfield players on the bench, while Vivianne Miedema, who scored both goals in the first leg, had to play in midfield.

"It's difficult for me to say where we're at because we have had so many key players missing – but that is not an excuse," head coach Nick Cushing said. "I am proud of the group. We have shown the togetherness and the fight and spirit

is there. We have caused Chelsea real problems." It completed a four-match sequence against the WSL champions, who beat City 2-1 in the Subway League Cup final a fortnight ago and repeated the scoreline last Sunday after City

had taken the lead in the league game through Brazilian winger Kerolin. Chelsea's comeback win left City seven points behind Manchester United in fourth place in the WSL table with five games to go.

Having had such a hectic schedule, expect rotation in the City team today, although they are limited in their options. Key midfielders Yui Hasegawa and Laura Blindkilde Brown, Spain defender Leila Ouahabi and goalkeeper Ayaka Yamashita have all been sidelined in recent weeks.

The season so far
City made a great start to the campaign, drawing 2-2 at Arsenal on the opening day before reeling off six successive wins. But a 2-0 defeat at Chelsea in mid-November was the first of four in their next five matches and since then City have struggled to find the consistency of those early weeks, as their injury list began to grow. Defeats to Manchester United, Arsenal and Chelsea since the start of the year have left them with work to do if they are to finish in the top three.

CLUB CONNECTION

Albion's top scorer Nikita Parris had a prolific four-year spell with City between 2016-19 when she scored 62 goals in 127 games, contributed 25 assists and broke into the England team.

During her time with City 'Keets' helped City win the WSL, the FA Cup and League Cup twice and reach the semi-finals of the Champions League. In 2019 she was named FWA Player of the Year before leaving to join Lyon.



They are still in the FA Cup though, having beaten Ipswich Town, Leicester City and Aston Villa all at home. They face Manchester United in the semi-final on 13 April for a place at Wembley.

Change at the top

It was a brave move by City when they replaced boss Gareth Taylor a few days before the Subway Cup final, but in Cushing they knew they were in safe hands.

During his first spell in charge between 2013-20 Cushing won the league, FA Cup and three League Cups before heading to MLS side New York City FC.

Under Cushing City have tried to dominate the ball more while retaining defensive solidity, and they are still a threat in attack despite the absence of top scorer Khadija Shaw and winger Aoba Fujino who are sidelined with injury.
