second goal, said a lot for the collective effort and character we showed.



INTERVIEW

‘WE’RE LOOKING UP THE TABLE NOW’

Marisa Olislagers believes last week’s away win at Everton can be the catalyst for a strong second half of the WSL season

Albion defender Marisa Olislagers hopes the victory over Everton at Goodison Park last week can be a turning point in the club’s WSL season.

A first-half goal by Jelena Cankovic was enough to secure a first win in three for a team led by assistant coach Chris Roberts in the absence of head coach Dario Vidusic and the Seagulls are now into the top six.

Today we play our first home game in the WSL since mid-December against London City Lionesses.

Albion had to withstand some fierce pressure from the home side in the closing stages at Goodison and demonstrated a level of discipline and determination that gives Olislagers confidence that the second half of the campaign will bring better results.

Five of Albion’s six WSL defeats this term have been by the odd goal.

Olislagers said: “It was so important to come out of a tight game as winners. It showed that we can actually see games through, because the (2-1) defeat to Aston Villa in our last league game was a tough one to take.

“I thought we were amazing at Villa and deserved more. I think we should be proud about the way we held onto this win and showed so much spirit against Everton.

“The tough times have brought us together and we need to keep doing this as a group. I think we showed that we are a really good team who

are ready to work together to get results.

“Now we can 100 per cent start looking up the table. That’s the ambition we have – and I also think we have the squad for it. I really think the rest of the season can be so exciting.”

With Roberts continuing in the hot seat after Dario Vidusic was granted a leave of absence for family reasons, it was encouraging to see Albion follow up the FA Cup victory over Nottingham Forest two weeks ago with a second WSL away win of the season, the first of which came against today’s opponents back in December.

Cankovic, who scored the second goal against Forest after being introduced as a second-half substitute, came up with her first league strike of the campaign after being rewarded with a place in the starting line-up.

Goalkeeper Chiamaka Nnadozie produced a brilliant late save to deny Everton substitute Melissa Lawley an equaliser. The way Nnadozie dominated her penalty area was also a huge factor in easing the late pressure.

Olislagers said: “Chia is very good, very confident, and she is never afraid to come off her line to take the ball. That gives us a lot of confidence as a back line.

“You need to know that your keeper is going to be there when it matters and it really helps to ease the pressure to have that presence.”



Toffees unstuck in Albion victory

On their first visit to Goodison Park, the Serbia midfielder produced a cool finish from close range after she was set up by Kiko Seike just before half-time.


Everton pushed for an equaliser in the second half, but Albion held firm and Chris Roberts, who was part of Everton's backroom staff for six years, had a second win since taking over as interim head coach.

Roberts said: "For the first 25-30 minutes we were so good. In the second half we defended so well, but I don't think they created too many chances. Three points, a clean sheet, I am really happy."



Rado Vidasic

Women's and girls' managing director Zoe Johnson said, "We are incredibly saddened by this news. Rado was an integral part of our staff, team and club. The impact he had on our team and everyone within it will forever be remembered.

Women's chair Michelle Walder said, "We are all deeply saddened to learn of Rado's passing. As well as being a hugely respected coach, he was a well-loved member of our club who was a key part of building our strong team culture. He will be missed by us all."

"Our thoughts are with Dario, Rado's wife Jasna, and their whole family. We ask that their privacy is respected at this difficult time."

Fabian Hurzeler also sent his condolences to Dario Vidasic following the passing of Rado.

"I feel very sorry for Dario and for his family. I was in touch with him and I said that I really appreciate that the things his father gave to the club.



His passion, his love, he was always there. He was always fully committed, and it was a pleasure to work with him.

"We all feel for Dario and we will give him all the time he needs. I know that Dario loves football as much as his father did. So I hope that he comes back stronger and will enjoy working with us and for Brighton."

Rado joined the club in January 2025 as women's and girls' head of coaching, working alongside his son, Dario. He played an important role in the team's historic 2024/25 campaign, helping the side achieve a record WSL finish of fifth.

Before arriving at the club, he spent six years with Melbourne City, winning silverware across both the women's and men's programmes. He initially joined City as academy technical director and women's head coach, later stepping into the men's head coach role and guiding the squad to a title-winning season.

His coaching career also included spells with Brisbane Roar, Sydney FC, Melbourne Victory and Wellington Phoenix, reflecting his vast experience and impact across the game.

Building blocks

A new face in the WSL this season, the London City Lionesses are seeking a first win of 2026 under their new coach Eder Maestre...

London City Lionesses were founded in May 2019, when the team broke away from Millwall Lionesses to establish an independent women's football club.

The newly formed club entered the FA Women's Championship and over the following seasons established itself in the second tier with a number of solid mid-table finishes.

The turning point in the club's fortunes came in December 2023 when American businesswoman Michele Kang – who had earlier taken over ownership of Washington Spirit and Olympique Lyonnais Feminin – acquired the club. The purchase brought fresh investment, ambition and a move from Princes Park in Dartford to Hayes Lane in Bromley in the summer of 2024, while a high-performance training base was also established.

That June, the signing of Sweden captain Kosovare Asllani, the former Manchester City and Real Madrid striker, and the appointment of ex-PSG

coach Jocelyn Precheur was a real statement of intent. A strong Championship campaign followed, culminating in a 2-2 draw against Birmingham City on the final day of the season, which sealed a place in the Women's Super League for the very first time.

The Lionesses became the first fully independent club to reach the top flight of women's football in this country and, despite their backing, it still represented a seismic challenge for a club in its relative infancy.

Inevitably, there were many changes to personnel last summer, with the likes of experienced campaigners Katie Zelem (Angel City), Danielle van de Donk (Lyon), Grace Geyoro (PSG) and Nikita Parris (Albion) all joining the club.

In fact, 17 permanent signings were made – including ex-Seagulls left-back Poppy Pattinson – while 13 players left the club, so it took time for the new-look side to find its feet. Heavy defeats to Arsenal (4-1)

and Manchester United (5-1) provided a chastening introduction to life in the WSL, but a first-ever victory came in the third weekend of the campaign. Everton were defeated 2-1 at Goodison Park, with forward Isobel Goodwin writing herself into the club's history books after scoring both goals.

Other notable successes in the opening half of the season included back-to-back 1-0 home wins against Liverpool and West Ham United, while high-flying Tottenham Hotspur were also defeated 4-2 at Hayes Lane. Aston Villa were beaten 3-1 at Villa Park in mid-November, leaving the side sitting a very creditable sixth in the table.

Eyebrows were therefore raised when the club parted company with Precheur shortly before Christmas, with a statement on the Lionesses' official website stating: "Following careful consideration, the club believes that now is the right time to begin a new cycle and pursue a

different strategic direction for the next phase of its development."

On 2 January, the club announced it had appointed Eder Maestre as Precheur's successor. The 39-year-old had served as head coach of Tenerife Femenino in Spain's top flight and had previously been assistant coach at Real Sociedad, where he worked with current Lionesses players Elene Lette and Sanni Franssi.

His first two league games in charge resulted in a 0-0 draw away at bottom-placed Liverpool and a narrow 2-1 defeat to leaders Manchester City, so he will be hoping it will be third time lucky this afternoon.

"I am very proud of our team; I feel we deserved more from the game," he said after the City defeat. "We want the players to understand that mentality and mindset are important. If we can reach these levels against Manchester City, it's a good point from which to start building something stronger."

ONE TO WATCH

Delphine Cascarino

Signing for the club earlier this month from San Diego Wave, French forward Cascarino is known for her highly successful spell at Olympique Lyonnais, where she won nine domestic league titles, six domestic cups and six Champions League crowns.

Making her debut in the 2014/15 season, she was rewarded with her first professional contract that summer and went on to make a total of 221 appearances for the club, scoring 43 goals.

Seeking a new challenge, Delphine moved to San Diego in July 2024, scoring her first goal in a 2-1 win against Utah Royals, and made a total of 34 league appearances, scoring seven times.

Her efforts earned a nomination for the NWSL Most Valuable Player, but citing a desire to be closer to home, she signed a three-and-a-half year contract with the Lionesses on 19 January.

A France international, she has made 83 appearances for her country, scoring 16 goals.



PAST MEETING

A solitary Kiko Seike strike secured all three points for the Seagulls at a wet and blustery Hayes Lane.

Dario Vidosic's side picked up a second successive WSL victory thanks, in part, to an impressive rearguard action which kept the Lionesses – who had won two successive league games themselves – at bay.

The deadlock was broken after just six minutes when Albion turned the ball over in midfield. Madison Haley quickly fed Seike, who raced through on goal before coolly tucking home.

The hosts responded with former Seagull Nikita Parris seeing a 20-yard shot superbly tipped over the bar by Chiamaka Nnadozie.

The hosts continued to search for an equaliser, but the Albion defence – along with the impressive Nnadozie – stood firm in front of a record home league crowd of 3,302.

"It was a tough game and I don't think the conditions helped," said Vidosic. "Overall we defended well and looked very solid in the second half against a front line that is very dangerous."

"We made some stupid mistakes, but with younger players, that is going to happen, it is part of their development," said then-Lionesses coach Jocelyn Precheur. "I don't blame any players, but we need some experience for these types of games."


