INTERVIEW

FROM COLOMBIA TO ENGLAND

Olivia Jackson sat down with our Colombian defender Manuela Vanegas ahead of today's game to discuss her journey and first season in the WSL

What inspired your love of football?

I grew up around football. My dad (Hector) and my brother (Franky) both played and I wanted to join in with them. In my town, Antioquia close to Medellin, we love football! At five years old I knew I wanted to play football. Every day I worked hard to achieve my dream of becoming a professional footballer and I was the first in my family to achieve this.

Who were your football idols when you were growing up?

Cristiano Ronaldo and Marta (Vieira da Silva) were my idols when I was growing up. I had the opportunity to play against Marta when I was 18 years old.

It was during my first international tournament with Colombia, the Copa America Femenina in 2018.

That match was an amazing experience, and she is a legend of the game. I spoke to her afterwards, told her how much I loved her and that she is the best!

It was inspiring to be up against such a great player and extremely motivating when I was younger.

What is it like to represent your country Colombia on the international stage?

It is an amazing feeling to represent your country and an opportunity to improve women's football back home. When you hear the national anthem, it is a beautiful moment.

I love my country, I love my people and I am proud to be from Colombia. We need more Colombian people in the city of Brighton!

We have amazing, very talented Colombian players. Every year, more Colombian footballers move to other countries to play in the best leagues in the world.

Across places like Europe, America and Spain there is great representation. It also helps improve the national team because we are playing against the best players in the world.

How does it feel to play in the WSL?

England is one of the best leagues in the world, for both women and men. Some of the most talented players are here, and the level of their ability is amazing.

I am very happy and excited to be playing in England because it is a great place to improve my football and achieve my dreams.

All my teammates are amazing players and lovely people off the pitch. I have a good relationship with everyone; I spend time with Chiamaka (Nnadozie), Aisha (Masaka) and Carla (Camacho). I can speak Spanish with Carla which is nice.

How does it feel to be getting more minutes for Albion after your injury?

I am happy because last year I was injured, so it feels good playing with the team regularly. We have amazing players and a strong team; it is great being more involved.

The most important thing is we are together as a group and hopefully we can get back to winning ways on Sunday against Arsenal.

I want to help my team as much as I can in training, on the pitch, wherever I can assist.

What is the mood ahead of the Arsenal game?

It will be an amazing game, my first time playing against Arsenal. We are prepared for the match. The team knows it will not be easy, especially after the last result. We are together, working hard every day to improve because it is important to win and secure the three points.





Late heartbreak for Albion

A dramatic late West Ham comeback cost the Seagulls all three points at the Chigwell Construction Stadium.

With just nine minutes of the game remaining, memorable strikes from Kiko Seike and Manuela Vanegas - her first goal for the club - looked set to make it back-to-back away victories for the Albion.

Yet, incredibly, the Hammers scored three times in the closing stages to make it consecutive defeats for the Seagulls.

Seike lobbed the keeper from outside the box to put Albion ahead in the first half, before Vanegas joined the attack and fired home right-footed to put Albion 2-0 in front.

But then West Ham hit back with goals from Ffion Morgan, Shekiera Martinez and Viviane Asseyi.



Albion made to pay for missed chances

London City Lionesses avenged their 1-0 loss before Christmas to Albion with a smash-and-grab win in our last game at the Broadfield Stadium.

Kiko Seike's instinctive finish was no more than Albion deserved for a strong performance in the opening 40 minutes, but two defensive lapses before half-time were punished by Moeka Minami's own goal and Freya Godfrey's powerful finish.

Madison Haley and Nadine Noordam both hit the post and Albion had other opportunities, but the equaliser, which was the minimum they deserved for what was a good performance, eluded them.

Gunning for glory

It's been a memorable period in the history of the Arsenal Women's team since their visit to Broadfield Stadium last May

Following the Seagulls' 4-2 victory, the Gunners ended their WSL campaign with a thrilling 4-3 win against Manchester United at the Emirates - a result that left the side in good stead ahead of their Champions League Final encounter with Barcelona in Lisbon.

Having dispatched Real Madrid and Lyon in breathtaking fashion during the knockout stage, Renee Slegers' side headed into the final full of confidence, believing they could bring the coveted trophy back to north London for only the second time in the club's history.

It would be no mean feat, given that the Catalans had won three of the past four finals, but it was the underdogs who lifted the trophy for the first time since 2007 thanks to a solitary second-half strike from Stina Blackstenius.

The Sweden international, who was set up brilliantly by fellow substitute Beth Mead, took one touch before firing the ball past goalkeeper Cata Coll with

16 minutes remaining.

"This team has been together for a really long time and we've been working really, really hard to get to the next level, and being able to do it on the biggest stage is amazing," said Leah Williamson after the game. "I just think some people had the game of their lives, and that is what you need, and we did it. I'm just so happy."

The celebrations continued into the summer and were further cemented by the permanent signings of Chloe Kelly from Manchester City, Taylor Hinds from Liverpool, and Olivia Smith, who also arrived from the Reds for what was, at the time, a reported world-record £1 million fee.

"It's my dream to compete for the biggest titles here in England and in Europe, and I'm excited to get started and contribute to doing that here with Arsenal," said the Canadian international forward.

She made a dream start to the season, scoring in

the Gunners' opening-game 4-1 victory against London City Lionesses. While Slegers' side followed up with a thumping 5-1 win at West Ham United, an inconsistent period subsequently cost them in their chase for a first WSL title since 2018/19. Back-to-back draws against Manchester United (0-0) and at home to Aston Villa (1-1) were followed by a 3-2 defeat at Manchester City, leaving the side sitting in fifth place in the table.

The Gunners have been attempting to catch runaway leaders City ever since, and while it has looked, on paper at least, to be a near-impossible task, back-to-back wins against current champions Chelsea (2-0) and at the Emirates against the Cityzens (1-0) last Sunday suggest that the north Londoners have finally hit their stride this term.

Both victories sandwiched a 3-2 extra-time win against Brazilian side Corinthians in the final of the inaugural FIFA

Women's Champions Cup at the Emirates, making Arsenal the unofficial champions of the world! "It's not often that you can write history at Arsenal," said Lotte Wubben-Moy, who scored the Gunners' second goal. "To win it in front of our fans - the first ever - that's what we do it for... we stand on the shoulders of giants."

With another historic trophy secured and the victory against City under their belt, the Gunners head to Sussex in buoyant mood, having also defeated OH Leuven 4-0 in the Champions League in Belgium on Wednesday night.

A brace from Frida Maanum, and goals from Alessia Russo and Smith have put the side in a strong position at the quarter-final play-off stage, with the second leg to come on Wednesday night.

"There were some really good goals," said Slegers. "[I'm] really happy with how the team is performing."

ONE TO WATCH

Olivia Smith

Ontario-born, Canadian international Olivia Smith began her club career in 2022 with the North Toronto Nitros. After netting 18 goals in just 11 league appearances, she moved across the Atlantic to join Sporting CP.

In her single season in Portugal, Smith scored 13 goals in 18 league outings, earning both the club's Player of the Season award and the division's best young player accolade.

Her performances caught the attention of several WSL clubs, and a move to Liverpool followed in July 2024. That October, she made history by becoming the first female player to score at Anfield, despite a 2-1 defeat to Manchester City.

She also scored twice against Manchester United in the Reds' first-ever win at the stadium, and her nine goals that season were recognised with both the Players' Player and Young Player of the Year awards.

After just one season, Smith was on the move again, this time to the Gunners.

Her winning goal against Manchester City last weekend was her seventh of the campaign and she followed up with a first-time finish against OH Leuven on Wednesday night.

PAST MEETING

Albion 4 Arsenal 2

Albion delivered one of the most impressive performances in the club's history with a first-ever win against Arsenal in the WSL.

The Seagulls capped off their final home game of the season in emphatic fashion and the tone was set as early as the 16th minute when Fran Kirby curled home a delightful effort from the edge of the box.

Goalkeeper Sophie Baggaley was in fine form but could do little to keep out the equaliser on 29 minutes when, having superbly kept out Caitlin Foord from close-range, the Gunners forward netted at the second attempt.

The hosts then took control of the game with goals either side of half-time through Jelena Cankovic.

The first came when the Serbian midfielder fizzed home a volley after the Gunners had cleared from a corner, while her second goal was a deft lob following a poor clearance from Arsenal keeper Manuela Zinsberger.

With just 54 minutes on the clock, Albion grabbed their fourth when Kiko Seike raced through on goal, and although the visitors searched for a way back into the game, they found the target just once in the second half - an injury-time effort from Mariona Caldentey.

"Today to be in front of our fans... and to give them that win did feel special. We had to be brave, we had to be tough... and we were clinical when we got our moments," said Dario Vidolic.

Slegers added: "It's definitely a shock... the goals we conceded were from turnovers of possession. We need to learn because this can't happen to us."


