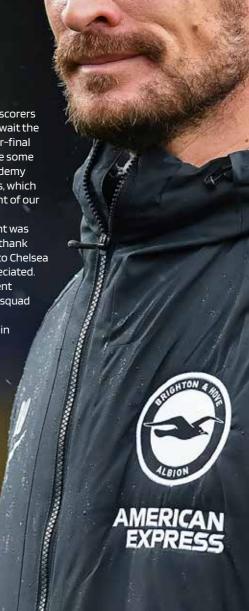
That was part of the game plan – to be patient, keep their transitions to a minimum and play the game in their half.

Midfielder Jelena Cankovic netted her first goal in Albion colours last Sunday against her former club Chelsea. She looks back at the game and assesses her opening months as a Seagulls player...

Jelena, let's start with Chelsea last weekend. What are your thoughts on the game?

I think it was a really positive performance – that's the feeling in the team. We created a lot of problems for them; we wanted to press them high, and I think we succeeded in that a lot. We know we made some mistakes, two of their goals were from our own errors, but they also made mistakes and we didn't punish them as much as we probably should. That was the difference in my opinion, but we showed that we can compete against Chelsea, a world-class team. We will take the positives hopefully in this next league game and

The team really grew into the game. After going two goals down, it can be so easy to give up, but we really showed our character and we also took a lot of confidence from that. We know who Chelsea are; they're undefeated, they're top of the table, but the next step for us is to take these chances and hopefully that will come in the near future.

How did it feel scoring your first goal for the club – and against your former team?

Obviously I played for Chelsea, but it was a game like any other with regards to me wanting to win. I want to win every game I play with this team. Obviously if I can contribute that's even better, but I'm really, really happy – first of all with the performance, if not the result, and also because I scored my first goal for the club. Hopefully there are more to come.

It's been a bit stop-start for you with injuries since you signed, but you've shown your class when you have played. What's your own assessment? It's been a really hard start for me. It's not nice

when you have some injuries, but I'm coming back from that now and feeling stronger. I've not been able to contribute and help the team as much as I would have liked, but that's in the past now. It always takes time to build new relationships within the team and obviously when you're injured, you miss out on that time. So I'm really focused on building these relationships with my teammates and making these important connections on the pitch. Obviously, with more game time and with more training with the team these things start to fall into place. I'm in a good space and want to contribute more as the

season progresses.

I'm still quite new here, but I can really feel that the team is growing. We're in a process, our own path, and that's what we focus on, what we all work towards and that's really nice to see. Obviously we're still only around halfway in the season and we haven't achieved anything yet, but I think the team is quite positive that we can achieve big things. The most important thing is to take it game by game and not be satisfied. Yes, we've done well to

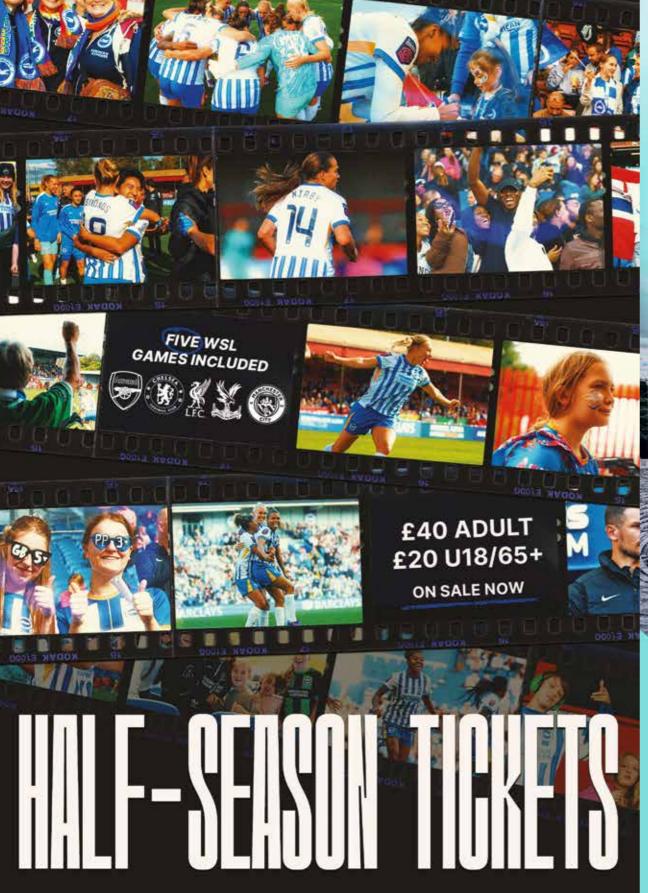
this point, but we strive for more and that's the feeling we have in the dressing room. We all believe in ourselves and we focus on that.

The style of play has also been pleasing to watch under Dario. How have you found it?

The coaching staff give us a lot of confidence in what we do. We want to have the ball, we want to be on the front foot and we want to press high. That brings a lot of confidence and it's something we're still working on, to really believe in what we can do. When you add that character we have in the team, which we showed against Chelsea, then all the signs are positive.

What are your thoughts ahead of today's game against Tottenham, our last before the winter break?

As I say, we focus game by game, but it would be really good if we could end the year with a win. Obviously that's the focus, but also to perform well and do what the coaching staff has asked of us. If we do everything right, I hope we can get the win – and also to do it for the fans. We've had a lot of positive feelings from them this season and we really feel that from the pitch. Hopefully we can attract even more people to come to watch us, which is really important. Their support has been amazing.

A quick glance at the WSL table sees Tottenham sitting in sixth place on ten points, in what is a congested table at present.

The summer saw Robert Vilahamn strengthen

his side by bringing in defenders Amanda Nilden (Juventus), Ella Morris (Southampton) and Clare Hunt (Paris Saint-Germain); midfielders Anna Csiki (BK Hacken) and Maite Oroz (Real

Madrid); and forward Hayley Raso (Real Madrid).

The season began on a positive note, beating league newcomers Crystal Palace 4-0 at home and a creditable 2-2 draw followed at Aston Villa -

Bethany England scoring a 96th-minute equaliser at Villa Park.

Unable to build on the momentum, Liverpool came away from Brisbane Road - Tottenham's home ground - with a 3-2 win,

while further defeats followed at Manchester United (0-3) and at league leaders Chelsea (2-5).

Two further tough encounters followed, with Spurs losing 4-0 at title-chasing Manchester City, which was followed by a 3-0 home defeat to north London rivals Arsenal, played in front

the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium.

Last weekend, Spurs returned to winning ways with a 2-1 home victory against Everton. The win delighted Vilahamn who was particularly please with the impact England made, having netted a penalty in either half.

BACK IN BUSINESS

After a prolonged spell on the sidelines, Bex Rayner made it a triumphant return to action against Bristol City earlier this week

There were plenty of smiles to be had following Albion's 6-2 demolition of the Robins in the Women's League Cup. Among them was Rayner who not only played a key role in the victory but also completed her first 90 minutes in an Albion shirt.

Signed from Sheffield United in the summer, the 25-year-old midfielder has faced a difficult start to her career on the south coast due to injury. She made her long-awaited debut last weekend as a second-half substitute against Chelsea before starting on Wednesday night.

"It's been such a long time coming so I'm buzzing," said a smiling Bex after the game. "It feels like I've been rehabbing

the whole time I've been here, so it's really nice to come in and get that first 90 minutes. Now I'm ready to push on in the next game and after Christmas."

Rayner last completed

a full 90 minutes back in March when her Blades side won 2-1 at London City Lionesses, so it's been a tough period as she's battled back to fitness – and at a time when she's had the upheaval of moving to the other end of the country.

"It's probably been one of the hardest times in my career," she told the matchday programme. "It's been the first long setback I've had to endure and because I'm so footballobsessed, not being able to play has been something that, at times,

"But I've been in the best environment possible. with a quality medical and performance team that has helped me get back onto the training pitch and in with the squad in recent weeks."

Following the 4-2 defeat against Chelsea last weekend, a game which was closer than the scoreline suggests, Albion took their frustrations out on Championship side City. It was a dominant display and Rayner was pleased with the side's application on the night.

"We dug deep and played some nice football," she reflected. "It wasn't always going to be easy against Bristol – they're a tough team to play

against as they showed against Leicester (drawing 1-1 against the WSL side and winning the penalty shoot-out in an earlier group game).

"We showed patience and were pleased with how we kept the ball and moved it around. I thought it was really good that we had lots of different goalscorers as well, which would have given confidence to those players on the pitch.
