against Tottenham Hotspur

I'd like to welcome Robert Vilahamn, his players and staff and the supporters who have made the trip down from north London. Like ourselves, Spurs want to play front-foot, attacking football so I'm sure we will see an entertaining 90 minutes.

We've had a good but busy week leading into today's game. We acquitted ourselves extremely well against Chelsea last Sunday and, if we'd been a bit more clinical with the big chances we created, we would have got something from the game, I have no doubt about that.

The support on a cold night was excellent and I'd also like to thank those of you who travelled to Chelsea last Sunday, it is much appreciated.

The process of improvement both as individuals and as a squad is ongoing. I'm pleased with the progress we have made in the first half of the season, but I know there is so much more to come from us. The message to the girls today is to make sure we go into the winter break having given the best version of ourselves against Spurs. If we do, we can sign off with a positive result.

Finally, on behalf of the players and backroom staff and everyone at the club, I'd like to wish you and your families a happy Christmas and a prosperous new year and thanks again for the support you give the team.

INTERNATIONAL ROUND-UP

Albion vice-captain Guro Bergsvand helped seal Norway's place in the European Championship next summer during the recent international break

Bergsvand scored in the 4-0 first-leg win over Northern Ireland in Larne and the 7-0 aggregate victory was completed in Oslo.

While Bergsvand, celebrated, there was disappointment for

Scotland who failed to qualify after losing 2-0 on aggregate to Finland after a goalless first leg. Rachel McLauchlan was an unused sub in both games.

Bruna Vilamala made substitute appearances in

Spain's two friendly wins, 5-0 against South Korea, when she came on for 19 minutes, before playing eight minutes in the 4-2 victory against France.

At under-23 level, it was a successful week for Maisie Symonds in

the Euros qualifiers. She played for 84 minutes in England's goalless draw against Norway in Krakeroy and was Player of the Match. She then missed out when the young Lionesses lost 2-1 to Sweden at Doncaster Rovers, but England remain top of Group B.

Marisa Oslislagers played both of the Netherlands' games, a 1-0 defeat to France and 3-2 win against Norway.

In the under-19 Euro qualifiers, Michelle Agyemang played in England's 2-1 win over Turkey for an hour and scored her first goal for her country. England lost their other match 1-0 to Poland and the Albion forward was not involved.

OFF THE MARK!

Midfielder Jelena Cankovic netted her first goal in Albion colours last Sunday against her former club Chelsea. She looks back at the game and assesses her opening months as a Seagulls player...

Jelena, let's start with Chelsea last weekend. What are your thoughts on the game?

I think it was a really positive performance – that's the feeling in the team. We created a lot of problems for them; we wanted to press them high, and I think we succeeded in that a lot. We know we made some mistakes, two of their goals were from our own errors, but they also made mistakes and we didn't punish them as much as we probably should. That was the difference in my opinion, but we showed that we can compete against Chelsea, a world-class team. We will take the positives hopefully in this next league game and build from there.

You also showed a lot of character to battle back from 2-0 down...

The team really grew into the game. After going two goals down, it can be so easy to give up, but we really showed our character and we also took a lot of confidence from that. We know who Chelsea are; they're undefeated, they're top of the table, but the next step for us is to take these chances and hopefully that will come in the near future.

How did it feel scoring your first goal for the club – and against your former team?

Obviously I played for Chelsea, but it was a game like any other with regards to me wanting to win. I want to win every game I play with this team. Obviously if I can contribute that's even better, but I'm really, really happy – first of all with the performance, if not the result, and also because I scored my first goal for the club. Hopefully there are more to come.

It's been a bit stop-start for you with injuries since you signed, but you've shown your class when you have played. What's your own assessment?

It's been a really hard start for me. It's not nice

when you have some injuries, but I'm coming back from that now and feeling stronger. I've not been able to contribute and help the team as much as I would have liked, but that's in the past now. It always takes time to build new relationships within the team and obviously when you're injured, you miss out on that time. So I'm really focused on building these relationships with my teammates and making these important connections on the pitch. Obviously, with more game time and with more training with the team these things start to fall into place. I'm in a good space and want to contribute more as the season progresses.

It's been our best start to a WSL season – what's your assessment so far?

I'm still quite new here, but I can really feel that the team is growing. We're in a process, our own path, and that's what we focus on, what we all work towards and that's really nice to see. Obviously we're still only around halfway in the season and we haven't achieved anything yet, but I think the team is quite positive that we can achieve big things. The most important thing is to take it game by game and not be satisfied. Yes, we've done well to

this point, but we strive for more and that's the feeling we have in the dressing room. We all believe in ourselves and we focus on that.

The style of play has also been pleasing to watch under Dario. How have you found it?

The coaching staff give us a lot of confidence in what we do. We want to have the ball, we want to be on the front foot and we want to press high. That brings a lot of confidence and it's something we're still working on, to really believe in what we can do. When you add that character we have in the team, which we showed against Chelsea, then all the signs are positive.

What are your thoughts ahead of today's game against Tottenham, our last before the winter break?

As I say, we focus game by game, but it would be really good if we could end the year with a win. Obviously that's the focus, but also to perform well and do what the coaching staff has asked of us. If we do everything right, I hope we can get the win – and also to do it for the fans. We've had a lot of positive feelings from them this season and we really feel that from the pitch. Hopefully we can attract even more people to come to watch us, which is really important. Their support has been amazing.

TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR

Our north London opponents will be looking for three points as they attempt to close the gap on the teams above in the WSL table

A quick glance at the WSL table sees Tottenham sitting in sixth place on ten points, in what is a congested table at present.

The summer saw Robert Vilahamn strengthen

his side by bringing in defenders Amanda Nilden (Juventus), Ella Morris (Southampton) and Clare Hunt (Paris Saint-Germain); midfielders Anna Csiki (BK Hacken) and Maite Oroz (Real

Madrid); and forward Hayley Raso (Real Madrid).

The season began on a positive note, beating league newcomers Crystal Palace 4-0 at home and a creditable 2-2 draw followed at Aston Villa –

Bethany England scoring a 96th-minute equaliser at Villa Park.

Unable to build on the momentum, Liverpool came away from Brisbane Road – Tottenham's home ground – with a 3-2 win,

while further defeats followed at Manchester United (0-3) and at league leaders Chelsea (2-5).

Vilahamn's side got back to winning ways with a 2-1 home win against West Ham United, with Hammers defender Camila Saez conceding an own goal in the 92nd minute.

Two further tough encounters followed, with Spurs losing 4-0 at title-chasing Manchester City, which was followed by a 3-0 home defeat to north London rivals Arsenal, played in front

of over 28,000 fans at the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium.

Last weekend, Spurs returned to winning ways with a 2-1 home victory against Everton. The win delighted Vilahamn who was particularly please with the impact England made, having netted a penalty in either half.

"I was very happy to see her in the way she pressed, the way she was in the box, her touch, how she was moving and running and the two finishes as well," he

reflected. "The leadership has always been there. Her way of acting as a great character is really good, but now she's also getting the connections right. I'm just happy she takes the journey, keeps taking steps, keeps scoring goals, because I think she can be even better in the future."

The winter break follows today's game and the head coach is looking forward to a breather and to take stock of performances so far.

"I think it will come at a good time, because we have had a tough run of a few games now," he added.

"We've come through a journey and every time you have a lot of games you need the recovery as well. So, even if we're winning, you need the break to recover, to reflect a little, to make sure we take the next step no matter if we're winning or losing.

"We're looking forward to the break."

BACK IN BUSINESS

After a prolonged spell on the sidelines, Bex Rayner made it a triumphant return to action against Bristol City earlier this week

There were plenty of smiles to be had following Albion's 6-2 demolition of the Robins in the Women's League Cup. Among them was Rayner who not only played a key role in the victory but also completed her first 90 minutes in an Albion shirt.

Signed from Sheffield United in the summer, the 25-year-old midfielder has faced a difficult start to her career on the south coast due to injury. She made her long-awaited debut last weekend as a second-half substitute against Chelsea before starting on Wednesday night.

"It's been such a long time coming so I'm buzzing," said a smiling Bex after the game. "It feels like I've been rehabbing

the whole time I've been here, so it's really nice to come in and get that first 90 minutes. Now I'm ready to push on in the next game and after Christmas."

Rayner last completed a full 90 minutes back in March when her Blades side won 2-1 at London City Lionesses, so it's been a tough period as she's battled back to fitness – and at a time when she's had the upheaval of moving to the other end of the country.

"It's probably been one of the hardest times in my career," she told the matchday programme. "It's been the first long setback I've had to endure and because I'm so football-obsessed, not being able to play has been something that, at times,

I've found quite hard to deal with.

"But I've been in the best environment possible, with a quality medical and performance team that has helped me get back onto the training pitch and in with the squad in recent weeks."

Following the 4-2 defeat against Chelsea last weekend, a game which was closer than the scoreline suggests, Albion took their frustrations out on Championship side City. It was a dominant display and Rayner was pleased with the side's application on the night.

"We dug deep and played some nice football," she reflected. "It wasn't always going to be easy against Bristol – they're a tough team to play

against as they showed against Leicester (drawing 1-1 against the WSL side and winning the penalty shoot-out in an earlier group game).

"We showed patience and were pleased with how we kept the ball and moved it around. I thought it was really good that we had lots of different goalscorers as well, which would have given confidence to those players on the pitch.



"You want to punish teams, you don't just want to get that 1-0. Obviously that's good sometimes when you're in a tight game, but when you feel like you can push on, it's good to be hungry and to try to get as many goals as you can."

"But we came into the game wanting to get into the quarter-finals, so we're really happy that we've got there."

Attention now turns to this evening's game against Tottenham. Both sides are closely matched, as the current league table would suggest, but Bex is hoping the side can pick up a second victory at Broadfield Stadium in quick succession.

"We're taking it game by game but we're going into it ready to win," she added. "It's going to be really nice to play in front of the fans before the winter break and hopefully get that win to give all of our fans a nice Christmas present! While we didn't have our usual turnout on Wednesday, the fans that were there were so loud that it felt a lot bigger. It's always great to play in front of our supporters – and we thank them all for their support and the way they back us."
