# DARIO VIDOSIC

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to the Broadfield Stadium for our final home match of the season

Today we're up against a very good Arsenal team, and I'd like to congratulate their coach Renee Slegers, her players and staff for their achievement in reaching the Champions League final. To pull off such a fantastic victory against as strong a team as Lyon in the semi-finals speaks volumes for the quality of their squad and their resilience. Arsenal heavily rotated their team when they lost to Aston Villa last Wednesday, but we can expect a really tough game, just as it was at the Emirates earlier in the season.

It's hard to believe that the season is nearly over, it only seems like yesterday that I was coming to England to take up the role as head coach here at Brighton! Inevitably, some of our players will be moving on to new challenges in the summer and I'd like to thank all of the squad for their efforts this season.

Finally, a word of thanks to you our supporters. Your passion for

the women's team is unmatched in this league and has made such a difference this season. We have made the Broadfield Stadium a tough place for the opposition and away from home you have travelled in increasing numbers to get behind the players and support them regardless of the result, rain or shine.

All I would ask is for one more effort from everyone today and at Aston Villa on Saturday. We have never beaten Arsenal in the WSL so that is a massive incentive for us, as is trying to finish in the top five for the first time. So there is a lot to play for in these last two games, and your encouragement could make the difference.

Enjoy the game, enjoy the summer and I look forward to seeing you all again in September.

# TOP FIVE GOAL



Albion have two games left to try to secure their highest ever position in the WSL after a courageous comeback against Everton

**Albion trailed twice to the Toffees at Walton Hall Park last Sunday, but goals from Michelle Agyemang and Fran Kirby drew them level by half-time before Scouser Nikita Parris scored the winner in stoppage time against her former club.**

Next up for Albion is today's home game against Champions League finalists Arsenal and, having beaten Everton home and away, there is the opportunity to complete another double when we finish the season at Aston Villa next Saturday (12.30pm).

Albion haven't always got what their performances have deserved in recent weeks, so head coach Dario Vidosic was delighted with the character his players showed against Everton – and the outcome. "We've had some tough results when we played good football and didn't get the rewards," he said. "We have spoken about showing character in adversity and it was a fantastic reaction. We were patient and got what we deserved at the end. All three goals were beautifully constructed, and it sets us up for what should be a good match against Arsenal."

It was hardly a surprise that Parris's latest return to Merseyside resulted in a goal. She now has nine goals against either Liverpool or Everton during her career, having scored earlier this season in the defeat to Liverpool. She was delighted with her late strike, on an afternoon when she didn't have too many sights of goal. It was her sixth WSL goal of the season and made it 11 WSL goal contributions in her debut campaign for Albion.

"We started too slowly but we produced a response and the second goal just before half-time

was important in terms of giving us belief," said Parris. "We dominated the second half but didn't create many clear-cut chances, which I feel has been a theme throughout the season.

"We need to do better at that because in terms of possession we battered Everton in the second half and just needed that cutting edge, a good final ball.

"The goal came from repeated practice in training and also our analysis of where the gaps will appear and running in behind so that when their keeper came rushing out I knew I had to put it either side of her. (Assistant coach) Perry (Northeast) has been helping me with trying to score that type of goal. He said to me, 'If you only get one chance you have to take it' and that is what happened. It doesn't matter if the game is won in the first ten minutes or the last minute."

Since then, it has been all about building up to the challenge of facing Arsenal, who blew Albion away when the teams met at the Emirates in October after scoring three goals in the first 25 minutes on their way to a 5-0 win.

A sizeable away contingent will guarantee a lively atmosphere at the Broadfield Stadium today and Parris, who had a spell with the Gunners in 2021/22, wants Albion fans to play their part.

"We will need as many of our fans there as possible to help make it a tough, tough game," said Parris. "We know that if we have good possession in the game, we can create chances – it's then up to us to make sure we make the most of those opportunities in front of goal."

Coach Dani Bowman said: "Against a tier-three team with a lot of experience, some of whom have played in the Championship, I am hugely proud of how they showcased themselves.

"Losing on penalties is the worst way to lose and the girls are disappointed, but I thought it was an entertaining game and hopefully the fans enjoyed it. We didn't leave anything in the changing room.

"We're a young group with some high-level players coming through, so the future in terms of next season is bright and there is no limit to what we can achieve."







# ARSENAL

Renee Slegers has sparked a real Gunners revival in the second half of the season, with her side now eyeing the ultimate prize as the season draws to a close...

With coach Jonas Eidevall losing his job in October, following a 2-1 home defeat against Chelsea, Slegers, his assistant, took the reins initially on an interim basis. It proved to be a masterstroke with the Gunners losing just twice since in 16

WSL games – against the champions Chelsea in January and on Wednesday night against Aston Villa.

The impressive run also included a seven-game, free-scoring winning streak, which included an impressive 4-3 victory

at Manchester City and Emirates Stadium defeats of Tottenham Hotspur (5-0) and Liverpool (4-0).

Villa ended the sequence with a resounding 5-2 win during the week, yet with their Champions League place assured for next season

it could be forgiven if Arsenal minds were elsewhere, given their incredible exploits in the Champions League.

Topping Group C ahead of Bayern Munich, the Gunners faced Real Madrid at the quarter-final stage and following

a 2-0 first-leg defeat in Spain, they responded with a fantastic 3-0 victory at home, thanks to goals from Alessia Russo (2) and Maria Caldwell.

Arsenal faced an ominous task at the semi-final stage against eight-time Champions League winners Lyon. A 2-1 defeat in north London did not augur well, but Slegers' side put in one of the finest performances in the club's history, winning 4-1 in France – an early Christiane Endler goal setting the tone for a game in which Caldwell,

Russo and Caitlin Foord also found the target.

"We were unbelievable in a high-pressure moment against a top opponent," said the Gunners' coach. "I'm so happy and we need to celebrate these special moments but also stay humble and get ready for the next one."

Which is another ominous task, given fellow finalists Barcelona dismantled Chelsea 8-2 on aggregate in the other semi-final. We wish Arsenal well in Porto later this month as they

## CLUB CONNECTION

Alessia Russo started her career at Chelsea, but having made just one appearance in the Conti Cup for the Blues, she moved to the Albion in January 2017, with the Seagulls having won promotion to FA WSL 2.

The striker made her debut in an FA Cup tie against AFC Wimbledon the following month and also went on to feature in the Spring Series that year. Becoming an England U20 international in the process, she moved to the United States to play college football for North Carolina Tar Heels that autumn.

"There's so many learnings from this (Villa) game; how you prepare, how you execute, how you recover, and we want to bring all the learnings because we want to be on the highest level, playing the biggest games," she said.

"So, for us, all the learnings, we want to start applying them against Brighton on Monday."

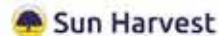

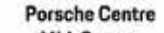
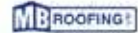

Fans be able to buy new or additional season tickets from Monday 26 May but the renewal window for existing season ticket holders is now open.

There will be updates to season ticket pricing and perks, as well as the seating plan at Broadfield Stadium for the 2025/26 season, with all change endorsed by the Fan Advisory Board.

We're aware of financial pressures many of our fans are under, with no one immune to the effects of cost-of-living increases. We continue to see cost rises across the business and have done everything we can to minimise the
