# DARIO VIDOSIC

**Good afternoon and welcome back to the Broadfield Stadium and the visit of the WSL leaders Manchester City**

Our welcome is, of course, extended to Andree Jeglertz, his staff and players and the City fans who have travelled down today.

The last few weeks of the domestic season have been quite disjointed with two international windows restricting our league and cup fixtures, but it's now full steam ahead with an exciting few weeks in front of us.

The FA Cup quarter-final was a memorable occasion for everyone at the club and I don't think anyone can argue that, on the day, we deserved to beat Arsenal 2-0.

I thought the way the girls executed the game plan was faultless. We went a bit more direct than usual to combat the conditions, with a strong wind drying out the pitch and making it quite bobbly. We were on the front foot from the first whistle and while Chi had to make one really good save, we carried the greater attacking threat in the first half.

This is what we are in the game for - to test ourselves against the very best and push for trophies.

It's also an exciting time for our fans, with an FA Cup semi-final on the horizon and four big games to finish the WSL season, including a match at the Amex. We are always appreciative of your support and I'd ask you to be loud and proud in these last few weeks of the season, starting today.

Finally, I'd like to wish our U19 head coach Dani Bowman, her coaching staff and players the very best of luck in their cup final against Birmingham City this afternoon. I'm sure they will give the very best version of themselves, and I hope it is enough to bring the trophy back to Sussex.

# DARING TO DREAM

**Fran Kirby and Madison Haley reflect on a special day as Albion move to within one win of a trip to Wembley in the FA Cup final**

Playing at Wembley is always something to savour, even if like Albion’s Fran Kirby you have had some unforgettable moments at the national stadium for club and country during your long career.

But another visit on 31 May for the Adobe FA Cup final is now only one game away for Fran and her teammates after arguably Albion’s best result ever – the 2-0 quarter-final victory at Arsenal on Easter Sunday.

It was a thoroughly deserved win too. Albion showed their adaptability in difficult conditions, scored two great goals and then demonstrated defensive resilience against one of the best teams in the WSL.

“We said, ‘Don’t do anything silly in the early stages,’” Kirby recalled. “We wanted to get them running back towards their own goal. Everyone managed it really well considering the conditions and the way we like to play.”

This shift to a more direct style in the first half ensured Albion remained compact and difficult to break through. While they had to weather the occasional storm, the defence remained resolute.

Madison Haley, who would score a superb first goal early in the second half, emphasised that the victory was a collective effort of concentration.

“We’ve been fully focused on the game plan and I think everyone, whether they started the match or came on, executed that plan well,” she said. “We had to dig in at times, but I think we showed that we can compete and beat the very best.”

It was Kirby who provided the spark, sliding a perfectly weighted pass through the Arsenal defence to find Haley in her stride.

Kirby, ever humble about her creative influence, joked about the service she

provided. “I know how strong and powerful Maddy is. If I do a bit of a dodgy pass for her, I know she’s going to get on the end of it! It was an unbelievable finish and it gave us massive belief.”

Haley said she relied on pure instinct to beat the keeper. “All I was thinking was I’m going to leather it and luckily it went top of the net.”

While the goals from Haley and Caitlin Hayes – who made it 2-0 with a header into the top corner from Kirby’s cross grabbed the headlines – the performance of Chiamaka Nnadozie in goal was equally vital. Kirby was quick to point out that the result could have been very different if not for the Nigerian’s performance.

“Chiamaka is an incredible shot-stopper,” Kirby added. “When those saves happen and you aren’t 1-0 down in a moment where you probably should be, you think, ‘Okay, we’ve got a sniff here.’”

That “sniff” turned into a certainty when Kirby once again turned provider. A pinpoint corner from the England international found the head of Hayes, who powered the ball into the top corner to make it 2-0. Haley was full of praise for Kirby’s impact on the squad.

“Everyone knows Fran’s quality and I think she shows it every time she’s out on the pitch with us. We feel really lucky to have her.”

Beyond the tactics and the goals, the quarter-final victory carried a deep emotional weight. Kirby took a moment after the final whistle to dedicate the performance to head coach Dario Vidossic’s father, Rado, whose birthday would have been the day before the match.

“I really hope he is proud of us and everything we achieved,” Kirby said in a touching tribute. “Dario is an incredible man, as was his dad.” It was a reminder that for this squad, the bond extends far beyond the pitch.

Next up is Liverpool at St Helens in the semi-final on 10 May.

“A game like this is a nice stepping stone for us to show that we can compete against the best teams in the world,” Haley added. “We’re fully focused on being at Wembley.”

“The belief is there in the changing room,” Kirby added. “We’re going to do absolutely everything to get to that final.” That dream is no longer just a fantasy – it’s a mission.





# Albion secure famous Cup win

Albion reached the FA Cup semi-finals for only the third time in our history after a statement win at Boreham Wood – our first win over Arsenal away from home.

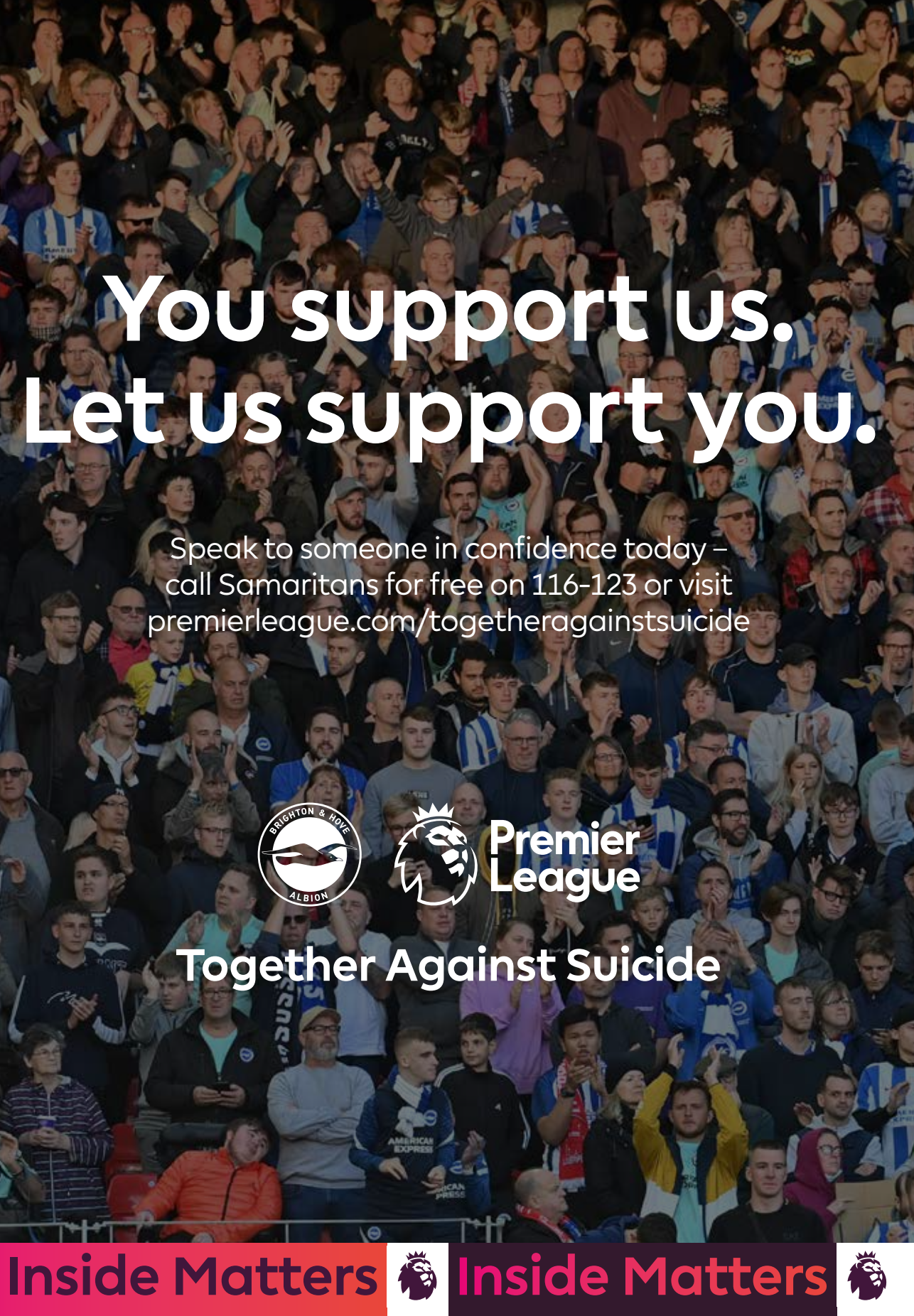
Albion were the more threatening team in the first half and made it count three minutes into the second period thanks to a brilliant finish on the angle by Madison Haley.

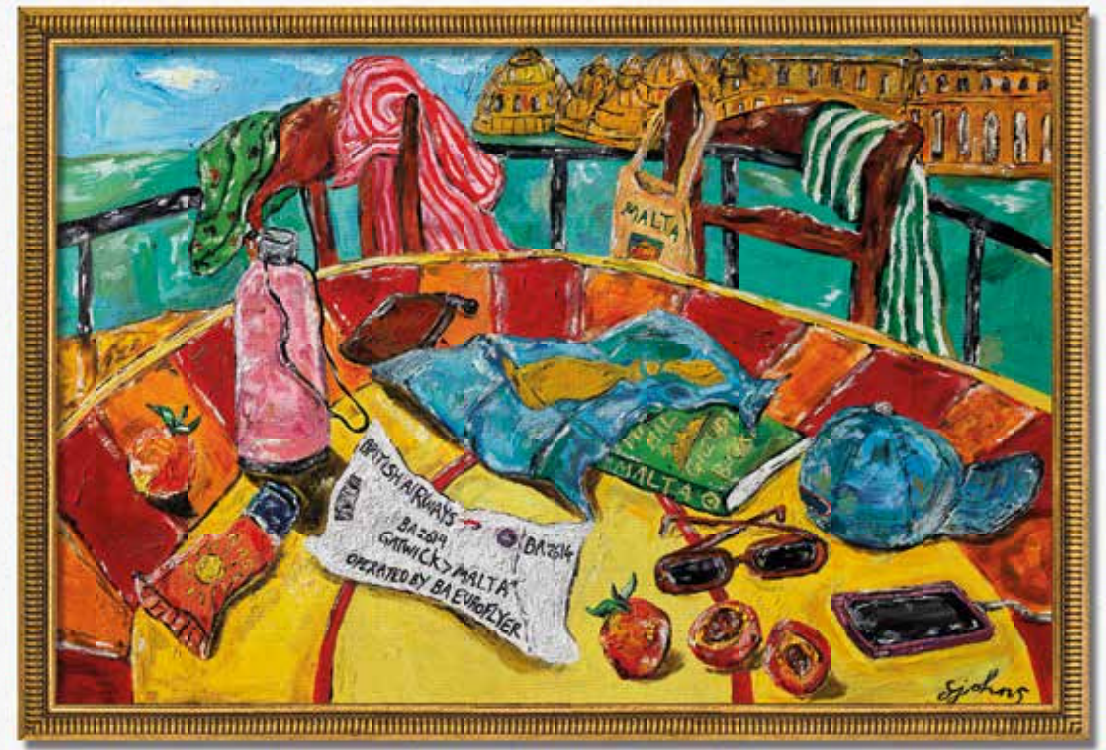

# City so close now...

Manchester City arrive at Broadfield Stadium this lunchtime knowing that victory will take them tantalisingly close to the WSL title

**Andree Jeglertz's side head to Sussex with a nine-point lead over second-placed Chelsea, having played the same number of games, and are 11 points clear of Arsenal, albeit with the Gunners having played two games fewer.**

City are, therefore, resounding title favourites as they close in on their second WSL crown, having last won it in 2016. Since that success, they have finished runners-up on six occasions, but such frustration has been tempered by three FA Cup and three League Cup victories.

To help wrestle away Chelsea's stranglehold on the title over the past decade, City made a change in the dugout last summer, with Jeglertz appointed as the replacement for Gareth Taylor, who had parted company with the club last March.

The 54-year-old Swedish coach and former defender linked up with the club

after leading the Denmark women's team at Euro 2025, while his CV also includes a UEFA Women's Cup win - later to become the Champions League - with Swedish side Umea in 2004.

"Manchester City are one of the biggest in the world," he said upon his arrival. "I will do everything I can to take them to the next level and continue the journey that has been started, making sure we can play attractive and winning football."

Jeglertz has been true to his word, and to help close the gap at the top Manchester United star Grace Clinton was a big-name arrival last summer, with Jade Rose (Harvard Crimson), Iman Beney (Young Boys), Sydney Lohmann (Bayern Munich), Eartha Cumings (FC Rosengard) and Laura Wienroither (Arsenal) bolstering the ranks.

Sam Coffey also arrived from Portland Thorn in January, yet Jeglertz has

kept faith with the bulk of the squad that finished fourth in the table in 2024/25, some 17 points behind Chelsea, suggesting a real shift in the mindset of the players and the impact of the head coach.

A 2-1 defeat at Chelsea on the opening day of the season suggested another campaign in which the Blues would be the team to beat; however, City then embarked on a mightily impressive 13-game winning streak, which culminated in a statement 5-1 victory against Sonia Bompastor's side in early February. Kerolin netted a hat-trick, with Khadija Shaw and Vivianne Miedema also on target as City moved 11 points clear of Manchester United in the table.

City have tasted league defeat on just one occasion since - a 1-0 loss at Arsenal the following week - but emphatic back-to-back victories before the international break against Tottenham Hotspur

(5-2) and at Old Trafford against United (3-0) have put Jeglertz's side firmly in pole position.

City also have a Women's FA Cup semi-final against Chelsea to look forward to next month, and forward Lauren Hemp is certainly relishing the run-in.

"It's an exciting couple of months ahead," she said before the international break, in which she assisted Alessio Russo for the only goal as England defeated Iceland 1-0 in 2027 World Cup qualifying. "I'm at this club because I want to win trophies and we haven't won many recently, so that is the dream.

"As a team, I know we're capable of winning trophies; we just need to show that at the most important times.

"We've got great togetherness in this squad and we stick together. We keep pushing, and we've got a great group who can surely get the job done."

## ONE TO WATCH

### Kerolin

Hailing from Sao Paulo, Brazil, the striker played for a host of sides in her homeland, including Palmeiras and Ponte Preta, scoring 14 goals in 35 games for the latter.

In April 2021, she moved to Spanish Primera Division side Madrid CFF before heading back across the Atlantic in January 2022 to join NWSL side North Carolina Courage.

Netting ten goals in 19 league appearances in 2023, Kerolin was voted the league's Most Valuable Player and was named in the NWSL Team of the Year.

With 19 goals from 48 games, she joined Manchester City in January 2025 on a deal until the summer of 2028.

This season, she has scored nine goals in 14 games - the highlight being her hat-trick against Chelsea in February.

On the international front, Kerolin made her Brazil debut in a 1-0 friendly defeat against England in September 2018.

She went on to play in the 2023 Women's World Cup before winning a silver medal at the 2024 Summer Olympics.

During the recent international break, she scored in the 2025 FIFA Series wins against South Korea and Zambia.



## PAST MEETING

### Albion 1 Manchester City 2

**City bounced back from their midweek Champions League elimination by Chelsea with a dramatic late win at Broadfield Stadium.**

Kerstin Casparij broke the deadlock in the 37th minute for the visitors when she tapped home a Mary Fowler cross.

Albion had the better opportunities in the game before City substitute Vivianne Miedema made the game safe in the 90th minute, drilling home from close range.

Charlie Rule netted a consolation by firing past City keeper Khiara Keating, but it came too late to salvage a point.

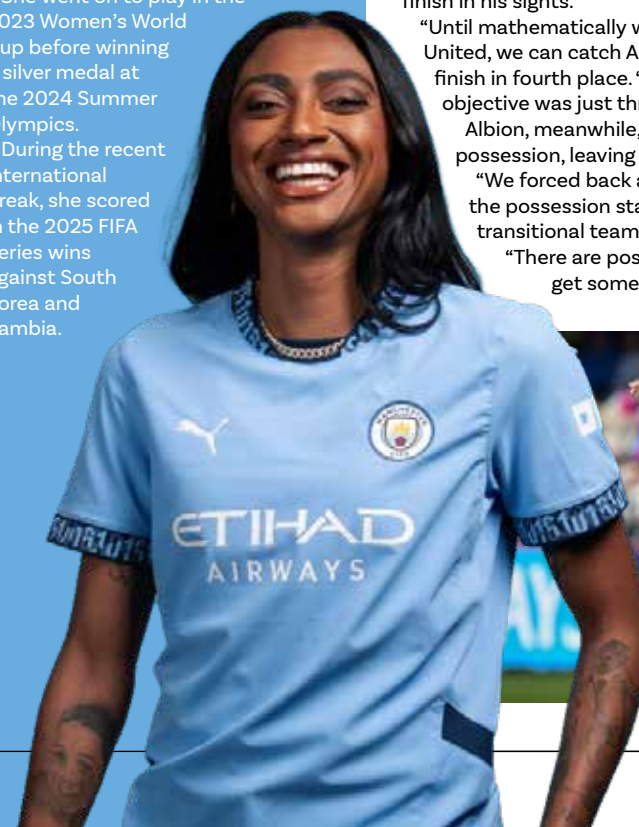
City remained fourth in the table and seven points off third-placed Manchester United, but interim manager Nick Cushing still had a top-three finish in his sights.

"Until mathematically we're out, we believe we can catch Manchester United, we can catch Arsenal," he said of a side that, indeed, would finish in fourth place. "It's about taking it game by game, and today the objective was just three points to stay within touching distance."

Albion, meanwhile, had 23 shots to City's 12, and also enjoyed more possession, leaving head coach Dario Vidovic a frustrated figure.

"We forced back a team like Man City, who usually dominate the possession stats and control games, and turned them into a transitional team in the second half," he said.

"There are positives to take away, but we are disappointed not to get something out of this game."

# GOOD LUCK TO OUR UNDER-19S!

**Albion WU19s head into the final of the PGA Cup today looking to round off a season of strong development with silverware**

Dani Bowman's team take on Birmingham City at Loughborough (3pm), and the final represents a significant milestone for a young squad that has continued to grow both individually and collectively throughout the campaign, with the opportunity to turn that progress into a tangible reward.

For Bowman the journey itself has underlined the value of working within the development game and the long-term impact it can have on players.

"It's really opened my eyes to what development football's like and the reward you get when you shape a young child's life and how they then develop into adults and go on and have success," she said.

"We want to go and win on Saturday but we also want to just get our players into our first team and make that as strong as possible.

"Mine is a dual role around developing our players, but also producing our players for the first team."

That balance between development and results has been a key theme throughout the season, with players gaining valuable exposure and contributing to the wider pathway within the club.

"If we can get our young players to have success and win, ultimately that would then have a knock-on in the first team."

Bowman's side are preparing to face unfamiliar opposition in a high-stakes encounter.

"We haven't actually faced Birmingham this year. So again, that's a new challenge for us," she added.

"We will obviously do our analysis work on them, but ultimately it's 90 minutes of a game where anyone could take it."

Our U19s drew 0-0 at Arsenal in the PGA League on Wednesday. They gained an additional point by winning the penalty shoot-out 4-2, while another positive saw Lily Dent get her first minutes since recovering from an ACL injury.
