DARIO VIDOSIC

Good afternoon and welcome to today's game against Liverpool. I'd like to welcome Liverpool's head coach Gareth Taylor, his staff, players and their supporters to the Broadfield Stadium

Liverpool were very active in the January window and their results and performances in recent weeks have been good, with four wins in their last six games. When we played them in November it was a very hard-fought match which ended 1-1 and I don't expect today to be any different.

After 24 days without a game it was good to finally be back playing again on Wednesday at Chelsea.

The 2-1 defeat was obviously disappointing, and I didn't feel in the first half we were brave enough in what we did. It felt like we were waiting for someone else to take responsibility to find solutions to really get at them in the first half. We could have done better for both goals, which came from similar situations when we didn't do well enough defending crosses into the box. When you don't do the basics right you will be punished, especially by good teams like Chelsea.

It was something we spoke about at half-time and the

response was really good. We started to play with our identity, limited them to very little attacking-wise and maybe on another day we could have taken something from the game.

Obviously it didn't help that Kiko Seike, Moeka Minami and Charlie Rule are still at the Asian Cup and were due to face each other in the final yesterday when Japan played Australia. It's a wonderful achievement for all three to be representing their countries in such a prestigious tournament and we look forward to having them back with us next week.

Like I mentioned earlier, it's a big game against a good Liverpool team that is our next challenge this afternoon. We have recovered well since Wednesday and we're looking forward to playing again in front of our own fans.

Please get behind the team as you always do and if we play to our potential for 90 minutes then I'm confident we can get a good result.



INTERVIEW

BUILDING TOWARDS A BIG FINISH

Fran Kirby is close to full fitness and looking to make a big contribution in the final few games of the season.

And the former England midfielder hopes the momentum built from Albion’s second-half performance at Chelsea on Wednesday night will carry over into today’s encounter with Liverpool and the rest of the season.

The Seagulls lost 2-1 to the reigning WSL champions at Kingsmeadow Stadium, with all three goals scored in a hectic opening 45 minutes. The hosts had the lion’s share of possession and chances in the first half, but it was a much more compact and confident display from Dario Vidosic’s side after the break. Indeed, the Blues were restricted to just a handful of shots at goal, while Albion looked the side most likely to score in the closing stages.

“In the first half we weren’t good enough on the ball,” conceded Kirby. “We were a little too passive and gave them too much space, but in the second half I thought we really grew into the game and in confidence, and towards the end we were pushing to get the draw.

“You have to respect the opponent and what they’re good at, but if you’re two yards off it they’re going to find the spaces to play around you. In the first half we just weren’t good enough as a team, so the message at half-time was to be more confident especially on the ball.

“There were spaces to use and exploit, and in the second half we were calmer on the ball instead of playing at 100 mph. You saw just how good we can be in that second half, playing quick one-tos. We grew in confidence and showed what we could do against a top side like Chelsea. There’s definitely plenty to take from that second half into the next game.”

That, of course, is Liverpool this afternoon. After a difficult opening half of the season, the Reds have been resurgent in recent weeks, winning three of their last five WSL encounters.

“They’re picking up points,” Fran added. “They’ve always played well, and we know that from when we played them earlier in the season (a 1-1 draw in which Rosa Kafaji netted a 93rd-minute equaliser).

“They’re now getting the results they probably deserved in the first half of the season, when they were playing well but just not getting the points on the board. We’re all looking forward to the game, but we’re also mindful of their threats, which we’ll need to nullify.”

Kirby will no doubt be hoping to play a key role as she continues to build up her minutes following injury issues this term. She managed 84 minutes against her former club on Wednesday night, and when asked how she was feeling, responded in her typically humorous manner.

“Old!” she smiled. “In all seriousness, I’m feeling good. I’m just trying to get myself back to a place where I’m able to push for the full 90 minutes.

“Coming back from injury, I’ve only been playing 45, so it’s all been about building on that and regaining my full match fitness.

But I’m in a good place, feeling confident, so hopefully I can build on that.”

Kirby received a warm round of applause from both sets of supporters as she left the pitch on Wednesday night, having served Chelsea with distinction over a nine-year period. This was her first return to Kingsmeadow as a player since her switch to the Albion in 2024, and she admits the occasion left her with mixed emotions.

“It was really nice to be back and to see the fans, who were so good to me when I was here, but I’m a Brighton player now and I really wanted to win or at least get a draw. That was disappointing, but we have a chance to make amends against Liverpool.”





Albion lose to champions on return to action

Albion went down 2-1 to WSL champions Chelsea at Kingsmeadow on Wednesday in their first game for over three weeks.

Without three first-team regulars – Kiko Seike, Moeka Minami and Charlie Rule because of the Asian Cup – Albion responded well after going behind and Carla Camcho equalised with her third goal of the season when her low shot found its way past Hannah Hampton.

But Chelsea restored their lead before the break and despite good spells of pressure in the second half Albion couldn't grab an equaliser.



Today's game is 'massive', says Maisie

Maisie Symonds is looking forward to putting the disappointment of Wednesday's defeat to Chelsea behind her in today's 'massive' game against Liverpool.

The skipper's return to her former club ended in a 2-1 loss, although Symonds was encouraged by a better second-half performance.

"I felt we deserved something," she said. "We were much better in the second half. In the first half we could have been braver on the ball, but you could see in the second half that when we were, we played really, really well."

"At half-time we said the game was still there for us. Chelsea had a game at the weekend and we were coming into it fresh. We knew their quality, we know they're the champions, but we went there to try to win."

"That's the mentality of our squad but unfortunately we didn't get it over the line on Wednesday."

"We're now very, very excited to play Liverpool today. It's a massive game. We need the crowd to be behind us to really help us get a positive result."



INTERVIEW

READY TO GO AGAIN!

Head coach Dario Vidosic outlines the work done during the international break and his pride at seeing three Albion players impress at the Asian Cup

Before facing Chelsea on Wednesday there had been quite a gap since our last game. How have the preparations been over the break with a notably smaller group of players available at the training ground?

It's been really good. When you have a smaller group stay back, it gives us a fantastic chance to work a little bit more individually. We can operate on a much closer basis, where you really dive into the specific details of what each individual needs to improve. We trained for about two weeks with only six or seven players. It was a nice chance for some to recover physically and mentally, and for those coming back from injury to do exactly what they need to get up to speed. Everyone's really refreshed and ready to go after such a long break between fixtures.

We obviously have a few key players away at the moment. How closely have you been tracking Moeka Minami, Kiko Seike and Charlie Rule at the Asian Cup?

We've been following them closely, and they're all doing incredibly well for their respective countries. They reached the final, which is brilliant for them all personally and professionally. Because both of their national teams have been strong favourites and advanced deep into the tournament, it means they are out of contention for this home game against Liverpool. We knew for certain they wouldn't be with us right away, but we couldn't be happier for them. They are representing Brighton brilliantly on the international stage.

It must be a difficult balance to strike when managing squad depth and tactical preparation with those key international players absent. How do you handle that dynamic?

It is a challenge, but at the minute, we've got what we've got. It's not ideal having three important girls away, but we aren't a team that sits here and makes excuses; I'd much rather try to find solutions and focus on the players we have available. We gave a few players returning from earlier international duties a bit of a physical and mental rest rather than bombarding them with tactical information

the moment they landed. Plus, we have players returning to the fold. Chiamaka Nnadozie's (AFCON) tournament was postponed until the end of the season, so she's back and ready. Fran Kirby is also back in training looking fit and healthy, though we naturally have to manage her minutes carefully depending on the intensity of the games.

With the first-team squad slightly stretched, does this present a genuine opportunity for some of the academy players to step up and get senior minutes?

There is always potential for that, but, unfortunately, our under-19s have succumbed to a couple of injuries recently as well. Grace McEwan has been training with us, but she is just returning from an ACL injury, so we need to be incredibly careful and let her build back in safely without rushing her. A few others have been sidelined through niggles. The academy had a tough week recently with two big games and a long trip to Durham, which is physically demanding. But everyone is up for inclusion. The standard is set, and if they earn it on the training pitch, they will absolutely play.

Watching the success of the Asian Cup, do you think there is still untapped potential in the Australian league and across Asia that WSL clubs could benefit from?

I definitely think so. There are some very, very good young players coming through over there. Holly McNamara is one who is already in the national squad, and Shelby McMahon at Melbourne City has a very exciting future - she was playing first-team football at just 15 years old. In the WSL, younger players are restricted and cannot be part of first teams or play senior games until they hit 16, which probably doesn't help their immediate development compared to those getting exposure at an earlier age overseas. Going back to Australia and looking across Japan and other countries in Asia, there is a massive amount of technical talent. It's been a highly entertaining tournament to watch, and as a club, we're always looking out for the next Moeka, Kiko or Charlie Rule.



Reds are aiming high

Liverpool will be looking to continue their recent good form in what has been a difficult WSL season for the Reds

Following last season's seventh-place finish it was a summer of change on Merseyside, with former Manchester City head coach Gareth Taylor taking the reins.

The Reds also lost Olivia Smith to Arsenal for a world-record fee of £1m, while skipper Taylor Hinds also moved to the Gunners.

With six players leaving the club and ten arriving, Liverpool have undergone a significant squad overhaul. New additions have included Kirsty Maclean (Rangers), Sam Kerr (Bayern Munich), Lily Woodham (Seattle Reign), Beata Olsson (Kristianstads), Alejandra Bernabe (Chelsea) and Alice Bergstrom (BK Hacken), while Denise O'Sullivan joined from North Carolina Courage for a reported club-record fee of £300,000 in January along with Aurelie Csillag from Freiburg.

With changes both on and off the pitch, Liverpool lost their opening six WSL fixtures, including defeats

at home to Everton (1-4), Manchester United (0-2) and Manchester City (1-2). They halted the slide with a 1-1 home draw against Albion, in which the visitors grabbed a 93rd-minute equaliser through Rosa Kafaji.

The following week the Reds earned a creditable 1-1 draw with champions Chelsea thanks to an equaliser from Olsson. However, it took until 25 January for the side to record their first league win – a 2-0 home victory against Tottenham Hotspur at St Helens. In a dramatic finish, Toko Koga netted a 94th-minute own goal before Mia Enderby made the game safe a minute later.

The three points came at the 13th attempt for the bottom-placed side, much to the delight – and no doubt relief – of Taylor. "It's really satisfying," he said after the game. "The second goal shows what we're about as a team, being on the front foot. We created a lot of good chances and we

looked more like what we wanted to be."

The victory also followed an emphatic 6-0 win at London Bees in the FA Cup, a competition in which the Reds have now reached the quarter-finals. They secured their place with a 2-1 fifth-round win against Everton, with Enderby and Olsson on target following an impressive first-half display.

League results since the Spurs victory have included defeats away to Manchester United (1-3) and Chelsea (0-2), along with home wins against Aston Villa (4-1) and bottom-placed Leicester City (2-0). The victory against the Foxes last weekend, courtesy of an early opener from Olsson and a late Ceri Holland penalty, followed on from the Everton cup win. It also lifted the side four points clear of the bottom of the table and above West Ham United into tenth place.

"Obviously it's nice to get the win – that's the

most important thing for the team," said goalscorer Holland afterwards. "It was a little bit scrappy, but we knew what the game meant and we're really happy to get it over the line.

"Every game is important right now with the position we're in. We did mention before the game there was a little bit of added pressure due to where they were, so we're just happy to get it over the line."

With some breathing space having emerged in the table, Taylor has challenged his side to maintain their momentum in the final weeks of the season.

"That's the message to the players: how high can we climb?" he said after the Foxes win. "We have some games coming up in these last five where each will present a different challenge and an opportunity to move up the table as much as possible. We look more capable now, which is impressive."

ONE TO WATCH

Beata Olsson

The Sweden international started her career in her homeland with both Enkoping and Uppsala before moving to the United States, where she played college football for the Florida Gators before joining the Florida State Seminoles.

In her first season with the latter, Beata netted 14 goals in 20 games and helped the Seminoles to their fourth national championship. Another title success followed in 2023 before a return to Sweden to join AIK in January 2024.

Netting eight goals in 24 appearances, Olsson moved to Kristianstads for the following campaign, where she netted an impressive 10 goals in 15 league appearances – form which secured a move to Liverpool last September.

As Gareth Taylor's first signing, she netted her first Reds goal in a 2-1 defeat to Spurs in November and further caught the eye that month with a hat-trick in a League Cup win against Sheffield United.

In December, Beata scored against Arsenal to become the first WSL player to score in four of her first five league starts. She now has a total of ten goals from 16 appearances and six goals from 11 WSL games.



PAST MEETING

Albion 3 Liverpool 3 Sunday, 20 November 2022

Albion were denied a second successive WSL victory as Liverpool staged a late comeback to earn a dramatic point.

The Seagulls looked in control after building a 3-1 lead, only for two late goals to undo their hard work.

Despite the hosts' early promise, Liverpool took the lead on 17 minutes when Melissa Lawley broke down the left and delivered a low cross that Missy Bo Kearns bundled home.


Albion responded when Katie Robinson delivered a pinpoint cross for Elisabeth Terland to head past Reds keeper Eartha Cumings. Soon after, Danielle Carter converted a penalty following a Liverpool handball and the lead was further extended in the 34th minute when Robinson's looping delivery sailed over Cumings and into the net.

After the break, Liverpool rallied and Shanice van de Sanden reduced the deficit with a close-range header on 76 minutes.

Matt Beard's side continued to push for an equaliser and it arrived when Rachel Furness headed home in stoppage time.

Albion were left clearly frustrated, but there were positives, with the side having collected four points from two games under interim boss Amy Merricks. "At 3-1 up, we felt in control, so to concede late on is frustrating," she said. "But there were a lot of positives in our performance. The way we attacked, the chances we created, and the energy in the team were all really pleasing."

Beard added: "I'm really proud of the players' character. At 3-1 down away from home, it would've been easy for heads to drop, but they kept going right until the end."



