I'd like to extend our welcome to Renee Slegers, her players and staff and the Gunners' fans who have travelled down for the game.

Despite going out of the Champions League at the semi-final stage on Saturday, I'm sure Arsenal will still feel there is a lot to play for in their remaining games and we can expect, once again, another tough test tonight.

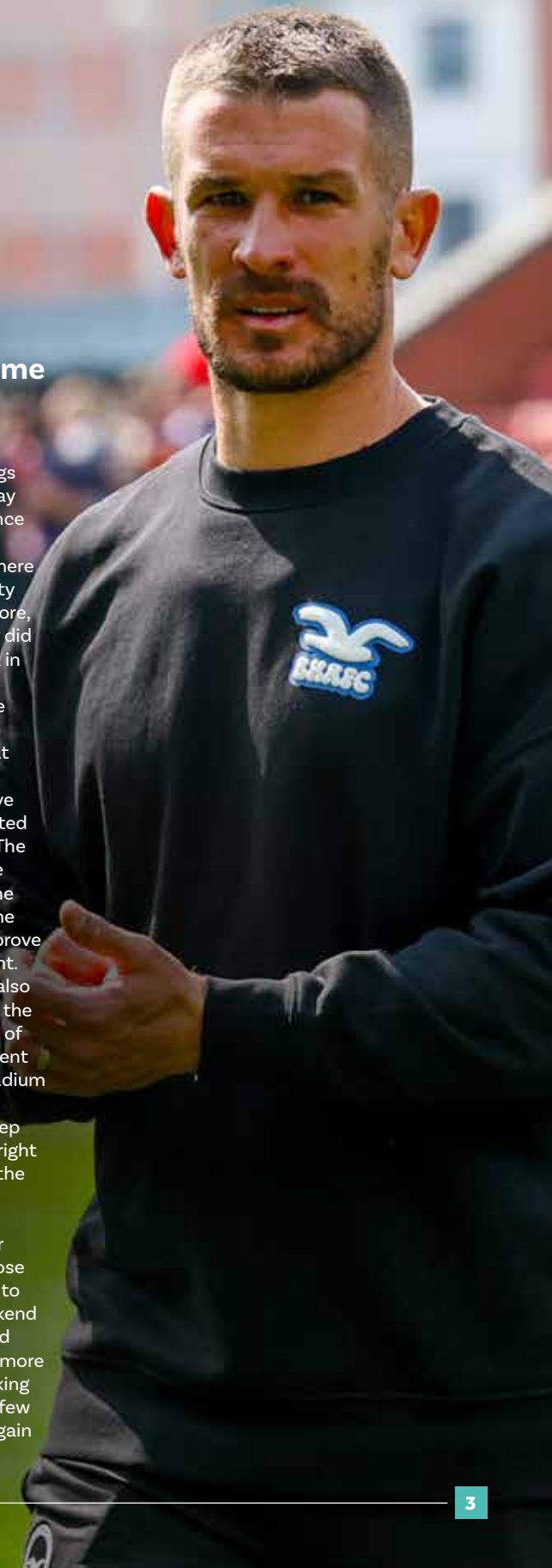

‘IT CAN ALL COME TOGETHER’

Albion unveiled plans for a purpose-built 10,000-capacity stadium for our women’s team last week – and it’s fair to say midfielder Fran Kirby is a big fan!

Of course Fran knows all about ambition, having won seven Women’s Super League titles and five FA Cups during her time with Chelsea, made 72 appearances for England and been voted Women’s Footballer of the Year. And it is the word she uses to describe Albion’s vision in announcing plans to build the first bespoke women’s football stadium in Europe.

“It shows the ambition of the club,” she says. “It’s not just what’s here, this is what we’re going to do. There’s actual evidence that we’re going to go in the right direction.

“It’s nice that I’ve been part of two clubs who really are focused on driving women’s football and pushing it in the right direction and giving it the time and attention that it deserves.”

Despite Chelsea’s on-pitch ambitions, their team played most home games at Kingsmeadow, the former home of Kingstonian and AFC Wimbledon and very much a men’s stadium in its original conception. The Albion stadium, to be built with a 10,000 capacity adjacent to the Amex, will feel very different.

“It’s your home, it’s something that you’re proud of, it’s something you know that you want to look after,” she added. “I’ve been in the women’s game for a long time now and I’ve seen my fair share of changing rooms and facilities, so I’m not really one that spends too much time thinking about the frustrations, but I think it’s more that you can make it your own.

“You can have your own personal locker, you can have pictures when you walk through and feel proud of something that you’ve got, and I think when you’re sharing stadiums maybe you can’t quite have that home touch that you want to have, and whether it’s things about the plumbing or the showers and things, you just know that it can be nicer elsewhere.

“When I first started women’s football, maybe you had one toilet and you’ve got a whole group of females that want to use the bathroom, but as the game’s grown and got better I think the standards and facilities have got better, but obviously having a stadium being built right I’m pretty sure the standards will be very, very high in our stadium.

“I think it’s a massive statement. It’s a massive part of the growth of the women’s game. It’s something that obviously the club have been speaking about for a long time, and there are so many other clubs doing amazing things.

“So we have to keep up, we have to stay up with them, and we have to keep building something that’s going to

attract players to want to come and play for Brighton. Things like having a purpose-built stadium, an amazing training facility, the quality on the pitch, they’re all moulded together.

“I think it will attract younger players who are maybe looking at up-and-coming clubs that they want to join in a few years. And it gives young academy girls who are here something to fight for as well: ‘I want to play in that stadium, I want to walk out for the first game with my mascot in a sold-out stadium just purposely built for the women.’”



Playing the majority of our home games at Crawley Town’s ground, she says, is far from ideal for fans as well as players. “We know that we’re asking a lot of people who want to support their club, but want to support their club in Brighton, to jump in their cars and drive to Crawley when there’s not much car parking space or jump on a bus or a train with two kids or whatever. And I think this is going to be a massive, massive help for them and for us in terms of us growing a fan base.”

Fran believes that the location of the new stadium will help make the men’s and women’s teams’ fanbases feel as closely linked as the playing squads do. “We’re part of the club, which I think is a really nice part of it,” she says. “The training ground is all one training ground. We have our own building there but we go over to use the canteen and the academy and the men’s building. We’re all connected.

“And now here, you’ve got the women’s stadium right next to the men’s stadium. It’s a hub and it’s all part of one football club, which I think is really, really nice. And I think it looks really beautiful. And the connection, I think, will only grow stronger between us, the men’s team, the men’s fans and the women’s fans. It can all come together.”



Albion denied in stoppage time

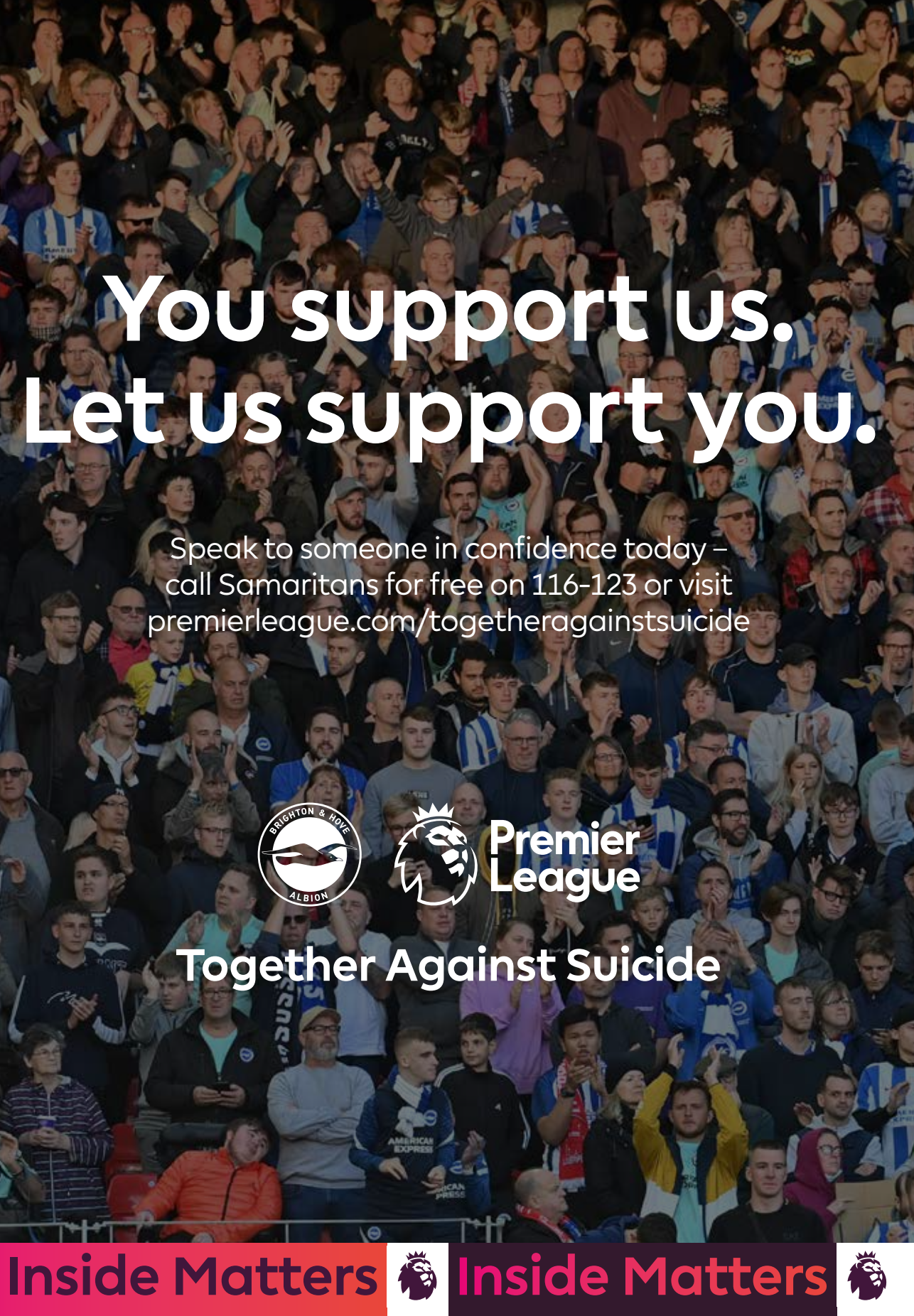
Albion claimed their first point in this fixture but were denied a win by an equaliser from Lea Schuller two minutes from the end of stoppage time.

Jelena Cankovic has made a habit of scoring important goals in the north-west this season, having got the winner at Everton in January, and she put Albion in front just before half-time when she cut out a pass from keeper Phallon Tullis-Joyce and rounded the keeper to score her third goal of the season.

United improved in the second half but Albion seemed to have sealed three points until the dramatic finale.

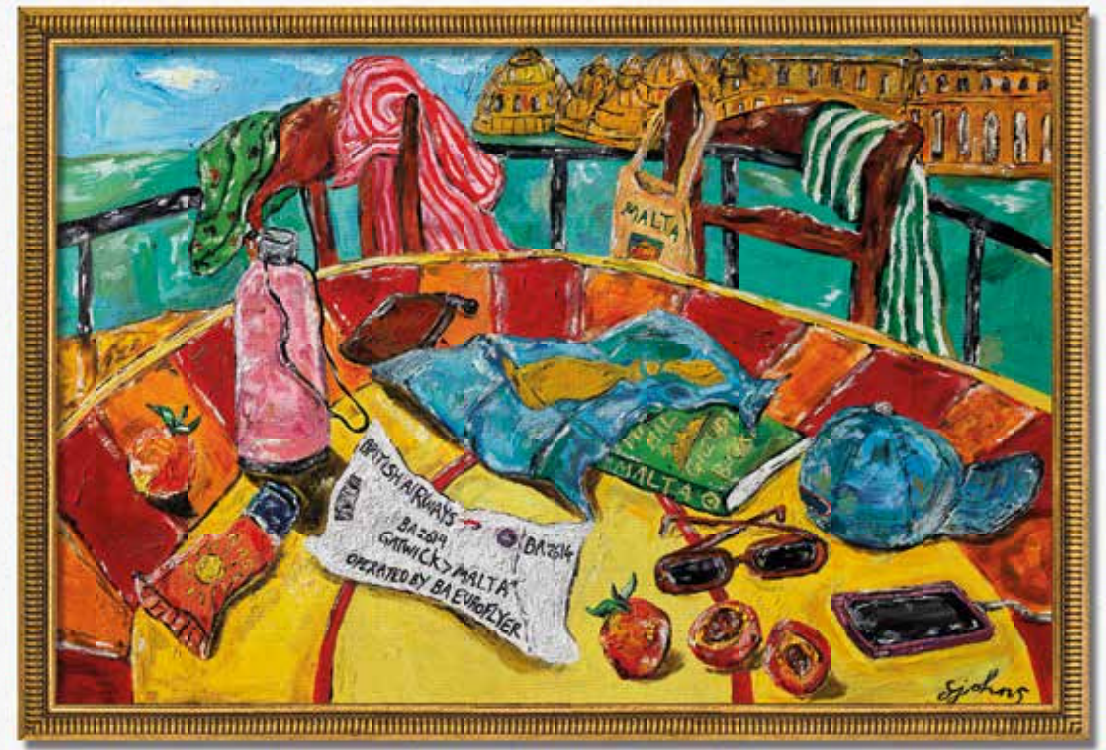

Gunning for glory

Arsenal head to Broadfield Stadium tonight hoping to bounce back from their Champions League exit at the weekend

The Gunners suffered an agonising 3-1 defeat against OL Lyonnes on Saturday afternoon, losing the tie 4-3 on aggregate, and ending hopes of a second consecutive final appearance.

Heading to France on the back of a 2-1 first-leg win, Renee Slegers' side fell 2-0 behind in the Groupama Stadium against the eight-time champions. Alessia Russo brought Arsenal back on level terms with 14 minutes remaining, only for Jule Brand to net a late winner for the hosts.

"We're disappointed, of course," said Slegers, whose side twice hit the woodwork. "It was about tight margins, and I think we struggled in certain phases. We're proud to be with the best four in Europe, but we wanted more, so we have to continue to work."

The defeat means all focus is now back on the WSL where Slegers' side still have an outside chance of winning the title.

They currently sit 11 points behind leaders Manchester City, albeit with three games in hand, meaning the Cityzens will need to slip up in their final game at West Ham United, while the Gunners will need to take maximum points from their remaining matches.

They have fallen behind the rest of the division in terms of games played due to their extended Champions League campaign. Finishing fifth in the league phase of this season's competition, a 7-1 aggregate defeat of OH Leuven in the knock-out stage preceded an epic 3-2 quarter-final victory against Chelsea over two legs.

In a bid to compete on four fronts this season, Arsenal brought in Chloe Kelly on a permanent deal from Manchester City last summer, likewise Liverpool skipper Taylor Hinds, Wolfsburg keeper Anneke Borbe, young Sweden international Smilla Holmberg and Olivia Smith,

who became the WSL's first £1m footballer when she, too, signed from Liverpool.

The signings created a stir among the Gunners fanbase and the optimism for a first league title in seven years was further fuelled by an opening-day 4-1 win against league newcomers London City Lionesses, which was followed by a 5-1 thumping of capital rivals West Ham.

Unfortunately a three-game winless run - back-to-back draws against Manchester United and Aston Villa, and a 3-2 defeat at City - proved costly and left the side playing catch-up. Indeed, the Gunners had fallen five points behind then-leaders Chelsea after Matchday 5 and they've been unable to close the gap since.

That's not to say the Gunners haven't been competitive, with the side in WSL overdrive in 2026. A 2-0 win at Chelsea in January followed by a 1-0 win against City set the tone and were followed

by further consecutive wins against London City Lionesses (2-0), West Ham (5-0), Tottenham Hotspur (5-2) and last week against Leicester City (7-0).

The only other blots on the landscape during this period have come in the domestic cups, with a 1-0 semi-final defeat in the League Cup and, of course, against the Seagulls in the quarter-finals of the FA Cup - both on home soil. It might have been a difficult few days for the Gunners, but according to vice-captain Leah Williamson, who signed a new deal last week, there is still much cause for optimism, with both the women's and men's sides in the title hunt.

"I think it's amazing," she said. "Arsenal's always competed but some years more than others and I think the positions we're both in, it's a credit to the work that goes on at the training ground by everybody that works there."

ONE TO WATCH

Olivia Smith

Ontario-born, Canadian international Olivia Smith began her club career in 2022 with the North Toronto Nitros. After netting 18 goals in just 11 league appearances, she moved across the Atlantic to join Sporting CP.

In her single season in Portugal, Smith scored 13 goals in 18 league outings, earning both the club's Player of the Season award and the division's best young player accolade.

Her performances caught the attention of several WSL clubs, and a move to Liverpool followed in July 2024. That October, she made history by becoming the first female player to score at Anfield, despite a 2-1 defeat to Manchester City.

She also scored twice against Manchester United in the Reds' first-ever win at the stadium, and her nine goals that season were recognised with both the Players' Player and Young Player of the Year awards.

After just one season, Smith was on the move again, this time to the Gunners, and has scored five goals and contributed three assists in her first WSL campaign for the club.



PAST MEETING

Albion 4 Arsenal 2

Sunday 5 May, 2025

Albion delivered one of the most impressive performances in the club's history with a first-ever win against Arsenal in the WSL.

The Seagulls capped off their final home game of the season in emphatic fashion and the tone was set as early as the 16th minute when Fran Kirby curled home a delightful effort from the edge of the box.

Goalkeeper Sophie Baggaley was in fine form but could do little to keep out the equaliser on 29 minutes when, having superbly kept out Caitlin Foord from close-range, the Gunners' forward netted at the second attempt.

The hosts then took control of the game with goals either side of half-time through Jelena Cankovic.

The first came when the Serbian midfielder fizzed home a volley after the Gunners had cleared from a corner, while her second goal was a deft lob following a poor clearance from Arsenal keeper Manuela Zinsberger.

With just 54 minutes on the clock, Albion grabbed their fourth when Kiko Seike raced through on goal, and although the visitors searched for a way back into the game, they found the target just once in the second half - an injury-time effort from Mariona Caldentey.

"Today to be in front of our fans... and to give them that win did feel special. We had to be brave, we had to be tough... and we were clinical when we got our moments," said Dario Vidusic.

Slegers added: "It's definitely a shock... the goals we conceded were from turnovers of possession. We need to learn because this can't happen to us."
