The Family Forest Carbon Program (FFCP) is operated by AFF. Launched in 2020, FFCP enables family landowners across 19 states to access the voluntary carbon market, a growing market that has traditionally been inaccessible to small landowners. FFCP helps landowners implement sustainable management practices that result in healthier forests, higher-quality timber, improved wildlife habitat and increased carbon storage, while providing them with additional income streams. Landowners may be eligible for several FFCP opportunities, including Improved Forest Management practices, and Fields & Forests.
