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North Paw Stray Fund Adoption Policies

- 1. North Paw Animal Hospital reserves the right to deny adoption at our discretion. Reasons for denial include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Other pets without current and appropriate preventive health care.
 - b. Other pets which are not spayed or neutered.
 - c. Lack of appropriate facilities at home (yard space, fencing, etc.).
- 2. The Stray Fund has an adoption fee for each pet. These fees, along with generous donations from our friends, allow us to continue this program. Fees are as follows:
 - a. \$125 if spayed/neutered
 - b. \$100 if not spayed or neutered, plus a deposit of \$25 to be applied to the pet's spay or neuter. This will be deducted from the fee at the time of surgery, or refunded to you if you provide proof that the surgery was done elsewhere.
 - c. If the surgery is done at North Paw you will receive a 15% discount on the surgery fee as well.
- 3. Upon adoption of a pet from the Stray Fund, the new owner will agree to provide appropriate health care for the pet, including but not exclusive to vaccines and heartworm prevention.
- 4. Any costs incurred from the time of the adoption are the responsibility of the new owner, including any remaining vaccinations and surgery.
- 5. Upon adoption of a pet North Paw is not responsible for any health or behavioral problems which may arise during the life of the pet.
