Tanya Donovan, DVM, DACVIM (Internal Medicine)

Topic: Dietary Management of Gastroenteritis in Dogs and Cats

Dr. Donovan is a board-certified specialist in small animal internal medicine. She earned her veterinary degree from Tufts University in 2004, completed a one-year internship at Angel Memorial Animal Hospital in 2005, and finished her residency in small animal internal medicine at Tufts in 2008. Afterward, she worked as a clinical professor at Auburn University before transitioning to private practice in Seattle, WA, Burlington, VT, and Portland, OR.

Her clinical interests include interventional procedures like laser ablation of ectopic ureters, percutaneous cystolithotomy, tracheal stents, and urethral stents for tumors. She is experienced in endoscopic procedures, such as bronchoscopy, gastrointestinal endoscopy, rhinoscopy, and cystoscopy.
