FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are the Hospital Hours?

Our hospital is open Monday through Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Saturday from 7:45 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. We are closed on Sunday.

Do I need an appointment?

Yes, patients are seen by appointment.

What forms of payment do you accept?

Cash, Check, MasterCard, Visa, and Discover.

Can I make payments?

Generally no, but the hospital administrator will make exceptions in hardship cases.

At what age can I have my pet spayed or neutered?

Spaying or neutering should be done at 6 months of age. Your pet must have an exam prior to surgery to help determine whether your pet is healthy enough to undergo the surgical procedure. Vaccinations are required to be current prior to the time of surgery.

Do you board pets?

No, but we do have a list of area boarders for your convenience.

What is your return policy?

Due to FDA Regulations, prescription items are unable to be returned.

What is your prescription dispensing policy?

Due to Wisconsin law, we are unable to prescribe, dispense, or sell prescription medications, or prescription foods without a current doctor-client relationship. Pets must be examined yearly in order to maintain a current relationship.

What is pre-anesthetic blood screening?

This is a blood test that is done prior to surgery on any animal over the age of six and in some cases under the age of six. It tests the organ functions, blood counts and clotting function of your pet. The pre-anesthetic blood screening is done to assure safety during surgery and the ability to heal following surgery.

Does my pet have to be on a leash?

Yes, for your safety and the safety of others, all pets must be in a carrier or on a leash at all times. We will be happy to provide one to you if needed while you are at our hospital.

Do you take work-ins & walk-ins?

If a pet is seriously ill or injured we will see your pet. Depending on the urgency of the situation you may have to wait to be seen after previously scheduled appointments. A technician may triage your pet upon arrival to determine your pet's stability. If your pet's condition is not of an urgent nature, you may be asked to make a regular appointment. Emergency appointments will be charged at the emergency exam rate.
