



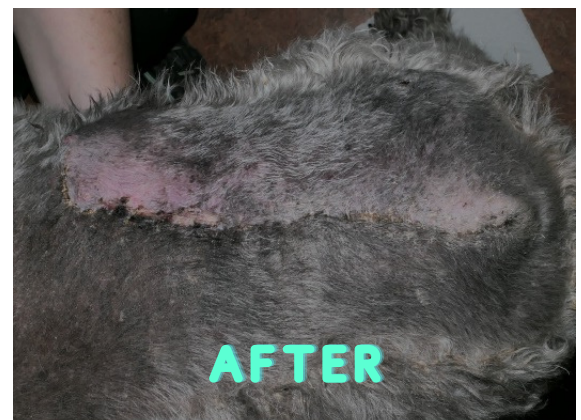

We (and she) want you all to know that even heart murmur dogs (and cats!) can do just fine under anesthesia when safe protocols and superb pain management are utilized! The mass on her rump weighed 2.2 pounds and really kept her down. Now, Stella is happily recovered and living her best senior life at home with her family!! 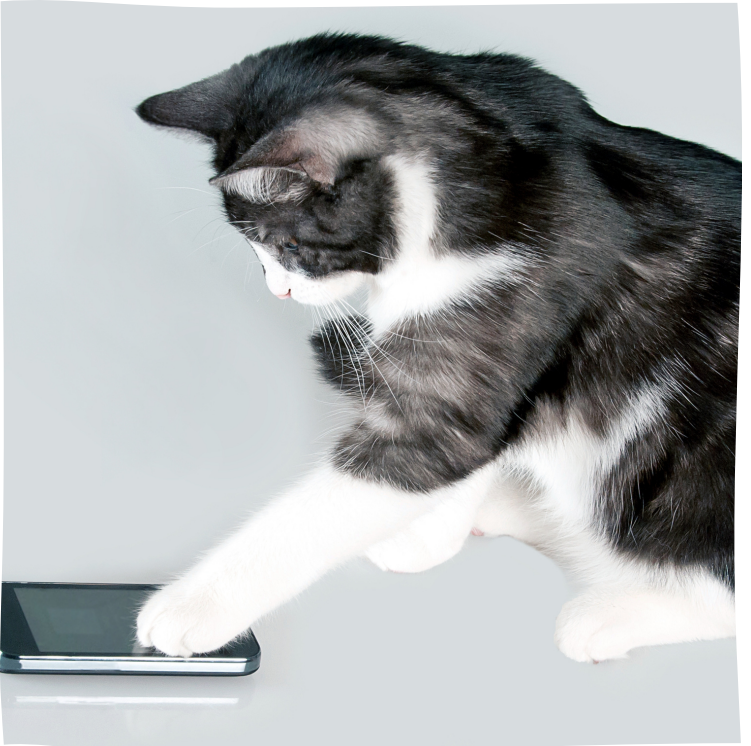
