



# Frenchie Challenges

We can all agree, Frenchies are stinkin' cute! But, did you know that these short-snout sweeties also exhibit unique neurological issues due to several factors? Here are a few key things to keep in mind:

- If a Frenchie **acts like it has back pain** (decreased activity, not wanting to jump or play, etc.) put it in a crate and get to the vet ASAP.
- **Paralysis** is a surgical emergency in a Frenchie!
- Frenchie's back issues tend to accelerate/worsen much more rapidly than other breeds. If your Frenchie has been diagnosed with a **suspected disc issue**, referral to a neurologist ASAP is indicated.
- **Seizures** in a dog greater than 6 years of age is likely not epilepsy. Consider referral to a neurologist for advice.
- **Change in behavior** (circling, decreased vision, loss of balance, falling, etc) may be indicative of encephalitis or other serious brain issue in a Frenchie. Consider referral to a neurologist ASAP.

## Tips to keep in mind:

- **Get Pet Insurance** - Trust us, it will come in handy with your Frenchie friend!
- **Crate train/playpen train starting at an early age**, this way they will be comfortable in an enclosed environment if medical issues arise that require them to be crated in the future.
