Who Do We Treat?

- » Pets experiencing critical illness or life-threatening emergencies (no referral needed).
- » Patients referred by veterinarians for specialist care or advanced recovery services.

What Do We Treat?

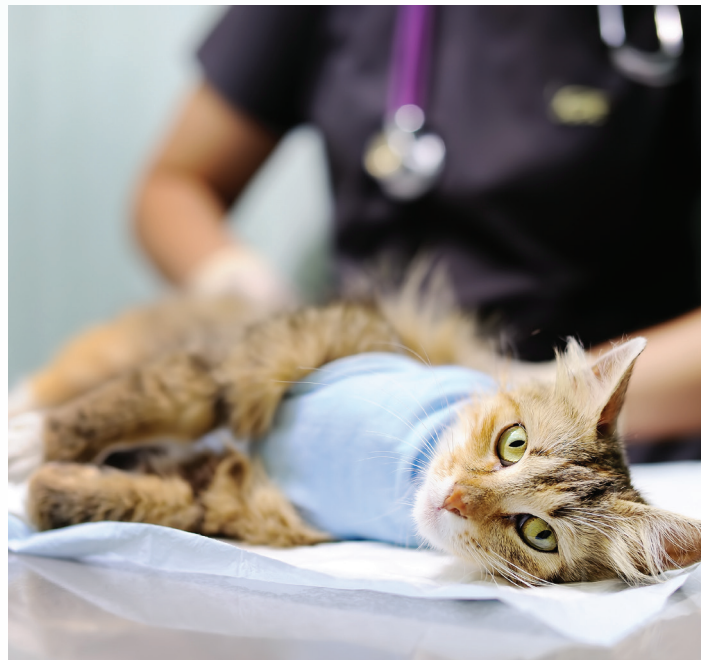
- » Breathing difficulties
- » Severe cuts, wounds, or excessive bleeding
- » Seizures or paralysis
- » Snake/insect bites or wild animal attacks
- » Progressive or severe vomiting, diarrhea, or swelling
- » Sudden collapse or lack of response
- » Any other severe symptoms
- » Heatstroke, allergic reactions, or anaphylaxis

If in doubt, call us at (321) 725-5365 or bring your pet to our hospital.

What You Should Do if Your Pet Is Having an Emergency

1. Ensure Your Pet's Safety
 - Move them away from hazards carefully.
 - Use towels or a soft cloth to calm them or create a stretcher if needed.
2. Contact Us
 - Call (321) 725-5365 with a brief description of symptoms.
3. Transport Your Pet
 - Use blankets for comfort and drive carefully.
4. Arrive at Our Hospital
 - Our staff will assist and provide further instructions upon arrival.

If you're uncertain whether it's an emergency, please call us for guidance.



What to Bring

If your pet is experiencing an emergency, please bring:

- » a copy of current laboratory reports or blood work
- » a copy of any biopsy reports
- » a copy of radiographs/ultrasounds
- » a list of all medications that you are currently giving your pet
- » a list of current and previous major health problems
- » any pertinent information from your current veterinarian, or any previous veterinarian that your pet has seen, that is relevant to the current problem

Please note: don't be concerned if you do not have all the above information available upon arrival; we can gather it at your earliest convenience.

If diagnostic testing or surgery (including endoscopy or ultrasound) is a consideration, food should be withheld after 9:00 p.m. on the evening prior to your scheduled appointment.

Be prepared. This saves precious time and helps us provide optimal care for your pet.
