WHEN TO REFER

	 Treat at your hospital with possible eventual referral	 Initiate treatment and call for appointment in the near future	 Call for immediate consultation
SEIZURES	Young dog, 1-2 seizures, normal between seizures <small>NOTE: If your patient experiences more than 1 seizure in 24 hours, please send them to the closest emergency veterinarian.</small>	Older dog, any number of seizures, mild changes to mentation or gait between seizures	Any dog with a single seizure longer than 5 minutes, cluster seizures or persistent abnormal mentation
DOWN DOG	Mild neck or back pain, mild proprioceptive or gait deficits	Persistent pain, static or worsening proprioceptive or gait deficits	Intractable pain** or unable to walk

**Still painful on 3+ medications

1. A patient must have a same day exam by a primary care veterinarian
2. A veterinarian must call SCAN and speak with a neurologist directly
***If after 5 PM and on weekends, please call the doctor hotline number from your hospital - (239) 234-5409
PLEASE do not give the hotline number to clients - this is for veterinarians only
PLEASE do not call a neurologist's personal cell phone - this may delay care for your patient
3. Email all records including doctor notes, bloodwork and radiographs (if pet is over 5 years old) to infonyaples@scanfl.com
4. After the above steps are complete, SCAN will contact the pet owner to arrange a transfer and establish expectations
