

Welcome Letter for Kittens

Congratulations on the addition of a new kitten to your family! The staff here at the Village Veterinary Clinic want to help you and your kitten get started off on the right foot by sending you some crucial information about a kitten's first year. This first year together will be exciting and demanding for you both and we will get to see you pretty often.

Most kittens require a set of three vaccines three to four weeks apart. The core vaccines that every kitten should get are the Feline Rhino/Calici/Panleukopenia combination and the Rabies vaccine. Frequently, depending on your kitten's lifestyle, another vaccine can be added. Did you know that most kittens are born with intestinal worms? It's true! They often pick up the parasites either in-utero or from their mother's milk. Did you also know that some of these parasites can be spread to humans? That is why we will always recommend deworming your kitten several times, to ensure they are not carriers in your household. During warmer months we will also recommend for you to continue to protect your pet from internal as well as external parasites like ticks and fleas. For most pets, we will recommend spaying or neutering around 6 months of age. Besides ensuring there aren't unwanted kittens, there are many health benefits to spaying and neutering your pet, not to mention a decrease in some unwanted behaviours. We realize this is a lot to remember. Don't worry we will send out email reminders for your vaccine booster appointments when they are coming due.

We have all heard how important nutrition is to our health. Well, the same goes for our pets. What we put in our pet's bodies will have a profound effect on their health. This is never more important than when they are young and growing, developing strong bones, teeth and muscles. It can be difficult to navigate through all the contradictory information on the internet and even more difficult when you are standing in front of rows and rows of foods at the pet store or the vet clinic trying to determine which food is best.
