

Itchy Dog? Fleas may be the Problem A New Study could be the Solution!

A few fleas on your pet could quickly become a full-blown flea infestation on your pet and in your home. Fortunately, our hospital is now enrolling eligible dogs in a national clinical trial to evaluate a potential new flea control treatment.

If your dog has fleas and has yet to be treated, you may be eligible to enroll them and receive FREE flea control treatments and exams as part of this study. All pets in the household (up to 3 dogs and 3 cats) will receive FREE flea control too for the 3 months of the study.

Pet owners may also be compensated for their time upon completion of the study!

All costs related to the study will be free. This includes:

- Lab work
- Physical Examinations
- Assigned Study Medication

What is required to enroll?

- 1) Dogs must have existing fleas at time of enrollment and cannot have had any recent previous flea or tick control medications prior to enrollment.
- 2) Enrolled dogs will need to visit our hospital 4 times over the course of the 90-day treatment period (all costs of these visits are covered).
- 3) Dogs must be in good health or stable condition and cannot be pregnant or nursing
- 4) Dogs cannot have tested positive for heartworms in the last 6 months.
- 5) Pet owners will be asked to observe and document their pet over the course of the study and administer provided treatments at home between office visits.
