BBQ & Picnic Dangers

- Keep food and trash out of your pet's reach: bones, onions, garlic, corn cobs, alcohol, and fatty meats can be toxic.
- Ask guests not to feed your pets scraps.
- If your pet eats something harmful, call FVRC immediately.



Heat & Dehydration

- Southwest Florida's summer heat can cause heatstroke quickly.
- Always provide fresh water and shaded rest areas.
- Avoid long outdoor activities during 10 a.m. 4 p.m.
- Watch for warning signs: excessive panting, drooling, lethargy, vomiting, or collapse.



Travel & Crowded Events

- Make sure your pet's ID tags and microchip are up to date.
- Secure pets in a crate or harness while traveling.
- Bring familiar blankets, toys, or treats to reduce stress.



Fireworks & Loud Noises

- Keep pets indoors in a secure, quiet space.
- Use calming sounds, white noise, or a fan to reduce stress.
- Talk to your veterinarian about anxiety medications or natural calming aids if needed.



Water Safety

- Always supervise pets near pools, lakes, and the beach.
- Use pet life jackets when boating.
- Rinse off salt, chlorine, or sand to prevent skin irritation.
- Bring plenty of fresh water. Pool and ocean water can make pets sick.
