

# Pre-Requisites for Attending Obedience Training Class

## What to bring to class?

- 1. Bring a 6' leash (no retractable leashes)
- 2. Any collar or harness (you want to train with)
- 3. Bring 100 small training treats (preferably chewy treats, easier to break up)
- 4. Don't feed your dog 3-5 hours before coming to class
- 5. Pen and paper (Optional)
- 6. Proof of vaccinations if the reception staff has not already checked it in
- 7. Your dog's favorite toy or chew item
- 8. Great Attitude

# What will you learn?: Beginners

In beginner either adult, puppy or fusion we will cover the basics within a controlled setting allowing for maximum information retention. We work on building and establishing proper, healthy and respectful lines of communication with our four leg companions while also establishing desired patterns and habits for the dogs to learn and perform.

## **BEHAVIORS:**

- Name Recognition Come Sit Down Stay/Release Stand Potty training Leave It
- Loose Leash Walking and much more

# What will you learn in Intermediate?

In intermediate we take the information that was taught in beginners and learn how to effectively apply it to the real world. If a client has already taken a beginner's course either at another facility or ours, but stopped at that level, they may notice the dogs don't work or listen to the best of their ability outside as they do in class or in the house. This class is to help empower families to communicate with their dogs in the real world where there are uncontrolled stimuli. At the end of the 5-week course the dog should be capable of performing information at a higher degree around distractions while paying closer attention to its parents with minimum treat intake. The parent/handlers should be able to properly communicate to the dog their expectations and desires.

## **BEHAVIORS:**

- Come- With increased distractions and Distance
- Leave it (random items on the floor, and from strangers)
- Place/Stay/Impulse Control Increased duration, distraction & distance
- Sit, Down, Stand- Perfecting the Dog Burpees
- Handler Skill Experience increase
- Meet and Greets and More



#### What will you learn in Advanced?

In advanced training we are looking for handler and dog to have developed a strong line of communication, compliance and application that can be applied in "real world" situations around multiple uncontrolled stimuli and environments. Dogs should be receiving little to no treats for the multiple behaviors they perform and instead look forward to the work, bond and admiration that they receive from their parents. At the completion of this 5-week course dog and parent should be ready to take the CGC (Canine Good Citizen) test. Whether that is a goal or not it should be attainable. The dogs and parents should be great representations of what a well-trained dog and a devoted responsible owner are!

#### **BEHAVIORS:**

Extended stay/place (at least 2minutes) Meet and Greets- Strangers and children Leave it- (Walk through obstacles ignoring items on the ground and from strangers) Re-call- Come when called, even if distracted Focus- Undivided attention is on handler (impulse control) Heel- Heel through a crowd of people Stay- Unsupervised
