

When plaque builds up on your pet's teeth, it can turn into tartar. Tartar is not only stinky, but it can lead to periodontal disease and a slew of dental issues, like pain, tooth loss, or bacterial infections BUT if left untreated, could lead to complications on the heart, kidneys, and other major organs!
