Dear Majority Leader Schumer and Minority Leader McConnell,

We write to offer our support for thoughtful, informed blockchain technology and digital assetrelated legislation. Recent debates surrounding the crypto taxation reporting requirement in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act underscore the importance of precise legislative language addressing blockchain or digital assets, to not create unintended consequences that disrupt American innovation leadership and growth.

We support the Wyden-Toomey-Lummis amendment¹ to the infrastructure bill, which clarifies the language in the digital asset reporting provision, omitting from the definition of broker any person solely engaged in the business of validating transactions, selling hardware or software for which the sole function is to permit a person to control private keys, or developing digital assets or their corresponding protocols.

In the coming months and years, Congress will consider additional legislation related to blockchain technology and digital assets. These technologies are complex and constantly evolving, and we stand ready to serve as a nonpartisan educational resource for legislators interested in understanding them better.
