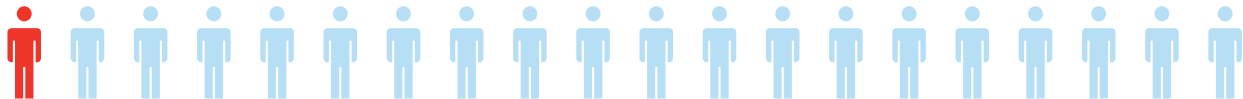


1.4 million people in the U.S. take Lilly's most commonly prescribed insulin. Of those:

To fill gaps in the current system, Lilly offers several insulin affordability programs for people who are most likely to be paying higher out-of-pocket amounts. This includes those in high-deductible insurance plans, the uninsured, and seniors enrolled in Medicare Part D.

Capping Out-of-Pocket Costs

For more than a year, Lilly has capped out-of-pocket costs for our insulins at \$95 per month. This cap applies to people with commercial insurance—or without insurance—and applies to an entire month's prescription, not just one vial or pen.

Lower-Priced Insulin

In 2019, Lilly launched a lower-priced insulin. Insulin Lispro Injection is available at a list price 50 percent lower than the brand name medicine.
