



The Games Leader is an important role as your duty is to make sure the game is fair. Your job is to know the rules of the game so our players can turn to you for help (so hold onto the instructions below!)

When players answer a question about their character, you've got to let them know if it's correct. The answers to all the questions are at the end of this sheet. You're also the judge when it comes to game tasks! Winners of each task get to roll the dice again and have another go.



## HOW TO PLAY RESCUE ME

6 players.

5 players pick a character to play and 1 player is the Games Leader.

Use the icon of your character to move around the board.

Can you rescue the characters from the rubbish bin and get them to recycling heaven?

- 1 Read the fact sheet about your character. Take 3 minutes to learn the facts and then give it back to the Games Leader.
- 2 Who goes first? Take it in turns to roll the dice. The player with the highest number plays first. Then play the game clockwise.
- 3 You must get the five characters to recycling heaven before it's too late. There are tasks along the way. Take it in turns and roll the dice to move.
- 4 If you land on a space with a **QUESTION** you must answer it about your character. The Games Leader will check if your answer is right. If you get it right you take an extra go.
- 5 If you land on '**PICK UP A CARD**' take one from the top of the deck and do what it says. The cards tell you to move forward, back, or go to the rubbish bin.
- 6 If you pick up a '**RESCUE ME**' card, hold onto it. It can stop your character from going to the rubbish bin. Hand it back to the Games Leader when you've used it.
- 7 **THE RUBBISH BIN:** If you don't have a 'Rescue Me' card, you must move to the rubbish bin on square 6 and play the game from there.
- 8 '**TASK**' cards: All players join in with the tasks. The Games Leader picks the winner after each task. The winner gets an extra go.
- 9 **THE GAMES LEADER** judges the winner of the 'Task cards' and checks if the answers to the questions are correct. They can speak up and keep fairness in the game.
- 10 The winner of the game is the player who saves their character from the rubbish bin and gets to recycling heaven first.

Once we've done that you can all roll the dice. The player with the highest number plays first.
