AN ACT

MAKING an Appropriation to the Arizona State School for the Deaf and Blind and Authorizing Expenditure From the Bond Retirement Fund of the Arizona State School for the Deaf and Blind.

1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
2. Section 1. APPROPRIATION; PURPOSES
3. In addition to the funds authorized for expenditure by the terms of
4. Section 2, the sum of ~~two hundred ninety five~~ thousand dollars is
5. appropriated to the Arizona state school for the deaf and blind for the
6. following purposes:
7. Dormitory building and furnishings
8. for state school at Tucson \$365,500.00
9. Classroom building and furnishings
10. for Phoenix day school 100,000.00
11. ~~Additional land for Phoenix~~
12. ~~day school~~ ~~30,000.00~~
13. TOTAL (3) ~~\$495,500.00~~
14. Sec. 2. AUTHORIZED EXPENDITURE
15. The Arizona state school for the deaf and blind is authorized to
16. expend the sum of ~~two~~ hundred thousand five hundred dollars from the
17. bond retirement fund of the Arizona state school for the deaf and blind
18. to be used in partial payment of the purposes prescribed by the terms
19. of section 1.
20. Sec. 3. EXEMPTIONS

1. The authorized expenditure from the bond retirement fund and the
2. appropriation made under the terms of section 1, shall not lapse until
3. the purpose for which the appropriation is made shall have been
4. accomplished or abandoned unless the appropriation shall have stood
5. until January 1, 1972, without an expenditure therefrom or
6. encumbrance thereon.
7. *Sec. 4. EMERGENCY*
8. To preserve the public peace, health and safety it is necessary that
9. this act become immediately operative. It is therefore declared to be an
10. emergency measure, to take effect as provided by law.
