B. Any false and fraudulent representation or pretense shall be
treated as continuing so as to include any money, property or service
received as a result thereof, and the complaint, information or indict ment may charge that the crime was committed on any date during the
period in question.

A. "Grand theft" is:

1. Theft of money, labor, or property OR ANYTHING WITH DETERMIN ABLE VALUE of the value of more than one hundred dollars.

2. Theft of money or property from the person of another.

3. Theft of a horse, mare, gelding, colt, cow, steer, bull, calf,
mule, jack, jenny, goat, sheep, hog, or any neat or horned animal.
B. "Petty theft" is theft of any money, labor, or property OR

16 ANYTHING WITH DETERMINABLE VALUE, not included in grand theft.
