### **Operational Updates**

#### Health

- The Refinery had no work related Covid-19 cases.
- To reduce traffic during the upcoming scheduled maintenance and the current provincial COVID case levels, there is a hold on non-essential employees returning to the Refinery and SOLO offices.

#### Safety

- The Refinery had two personnel safety incidents and both individuals received medical treatment and are recovering.
  - 1) An employee cut their middle finger when a drill bound-up on a sharp metal plate.
  - 2) A contractor cut their pinky finger when it was pinched between a hitch and light stand.



### **Operational Update**

#### **Environment**

- On August 26<sup>th</sup> at 10:11 p.m. there was a power dip due to a BC hydro electrical outage on one of their electrical feeds into the Refinery. This resulted in:
  - multiple equipment trips;
  - o an environmental exceedance of permitted SO2 from the Sulphur Recovery Unit (SRU). It's important to note that the exceedance is within ambient objectives (non-statutory limits on the acceptable presence of containment in the atmosphere), and
  - high elevated flare that caused great concern for the community.



### **Operational Update**


#### ...Environment

- On September 9 approximately at 4:00 p.m. the main reaction furnace in the sulphur recovery unit shutdown and resulted in:
  - o brief disturbance in the operation of the sulphur recovery unit.
  - o environmental exceedance.
- The SO2 was below the ambient objectives at all air quality monitoring stations.



#### **Tree Update**

#### Area 1 removals completed with appropriate approvals and permits:

- ✓ Oversized alders, cedars, hemlock and holly trees next to Tank 31
- ✓ Hemlocks, birch and cherry trees being the LPG operations booth
- ✓ Dead and leaning trees adjacent to the Gamma parking lot and firehall
- ✓ Willow tree that damaged City sewer lines
- ✓ Snags from trees removed in 2020

#### Other:

- ➤ The Refinery conducting its tree threat mitigation plan for 2021/2022.
- Working with City of Burnaby to determine scope of the mitigation plan.



### 2021 Scheduled Maintenance



Through October and part of November, we will complete some scheduled maintenance at the Refinery which will ensure we continue to operate safely and reliably. We understand that maintenance work may at times feel disruptive and want to assure you that our teams of planners and experts are working hard to minimize potential impacts to you and our community.

#### Here is what you can expect:



When: Scheduled maintenance will start the first week of October to mid-November.



Hours of Work: It's a 24/7 operation with the bulk of activity being performed from 7:00 a.m.- 11:00 p.m.



Traffic: There will be an increase in traffic with the additional contractors on site. There will be a 'no left sign' on Gamma to minimize traffic through residential streets. All traffic will be directed to travel west on Penzance Drive to make their way along Willingdon Ave.



**Impacts:** Neighbours may experience higher than typical noise and flare levels during the maintenance.

### **Human Health Risk Assessment (HHRA)**

- The Refinery is conducting a HHRA on its air emissions. Our existing air permit with Metro Vancouver expires July 2022. The HHRA will support the new air permit application.
- HHRA is a scientific process that predicts the potential nature and likelihood of harmful health effects that may occurs if individuals were exposed to chemicals in the environment.
- The Refinery commissioned an independent third party, WSP, to draft the workplan.
- We consulted the community and key stakeholders from August 19 to September 12 and reviewing all the feedback received.



### **Human Health Risk Assessment (HHRA)**


#### **Background**

The new air permit application includes the following emission reductions:

- 18% reduction in Nitrogen Oxides (NOx),
- 54% reduction in Sulphur Oxide (SOx), and
- 23% reduction in Particulate Matter (PM).
- Regulators and Health Authorities, including Metro Vancouver and Fraser Health, are reviewing study plans and the final report.
- The study will build off the UBC HHRA study and Metro Vancouver/Fraser Health update, executed in 2002 and 2013 respectively.


#### Human Health Risk Assessment Framework – Overview




### **Community Relations Update – FYI**

- BC Hydro Completed a System Impact Study at the Refinery
  - Next step is conceptual design
  - This process is led by BC Hydro
- Connect Coast Project in Vancouver Port
  - The build is part of the Connected Coast project which is a major fibre optic build spanning the entire BC coast.
  - Goal is to connect over 150 communities with high-speed internet via undersea fibre optic cables.
  - Work anticipated to start December 2021/early 2022 and plan to lay marine fibre-optic cable from the Vancouver Convention Centre, around Brockton point and out the Harbour to Gabriola Island.
