Overview of MV Update Content

Metro Vancouver has the regulatory authority specific to the discharge of air contaminants and management of non-domestic waste to sewer within the region. The Parkland Burnaby refinery has both an air discharge permit and liquid waste discharge permit that we administer. Both the permits have extensive monitoring and reporting requirements.

Typically, our summary at CAP is a snapshot of some of the activities related to the administration of the permits conducted since the last CAP reporting period. Topics can include:

- Site Inspections
- Summary of air quality complaints
- Odour surveys
- Response to specific Incidents (i.e. Parkland Advisories)
- Regional air quality management initiatives such as Bylaw development.

23	3 notifications regarding acid gas to flare/SRU. 0 high flare flow notification (> 50m ³ /min) 7 notification regarding sewer discharge. 11 notifications regarding stale data exceeding 4 hours (6 in Apr., 5 in May). 2 Level One Notifications – High flaring (April 22/22 elevated flaring due to minor maintenance on two processing units).

Parkland Air Quality Permit (GVA0117) Update

Parkland Refining’s permit was amended on January 27, 2021. The amendment was an 18-month extension of their permit term to allow for completion of Phase One and Two of the Refined Technology Assessment and supporting dispersion modelling.

- All Technology Assessment reports required in Parkland’s current permit have been submitted and reviewed by Metro Vancouver staff.

- February 2, 2022- Parkland’s final application for a new permit was considered complete by Metro Vancouver staff. Under Public Notification Regulation B.C. Reg. 202/94, Parkland Refining was directed to publish an Environmental Protection Notice.
- Parkland Refining’s Public Notification 30-day time period to provide written comments for District Director consideration ended on April 9, 2022. Written comments received after April 9th will still be considered up until a decision is made by the District Director.
- January 31, 2022 – Parkland submitted the final Human Health Risk Assessment (HHRA) report in support of Parkland’s permit application. Results of the HHRA were presented by Parkland’s consultant during a public information session on March 10, 2022.
- Metro Vancouver staff conducting a technical review of Parkland’s final application and HHRA. The results of the technical review will help inform a permit recommendation for the District Director’s consideration.
- FHA and VCH authorities are currently reviewing Parkland’s HHRA. Metro Vancouver staff are awaiting the results of their review. The results of their review will help inform a permit recommendation for the District Director’s consideration.
