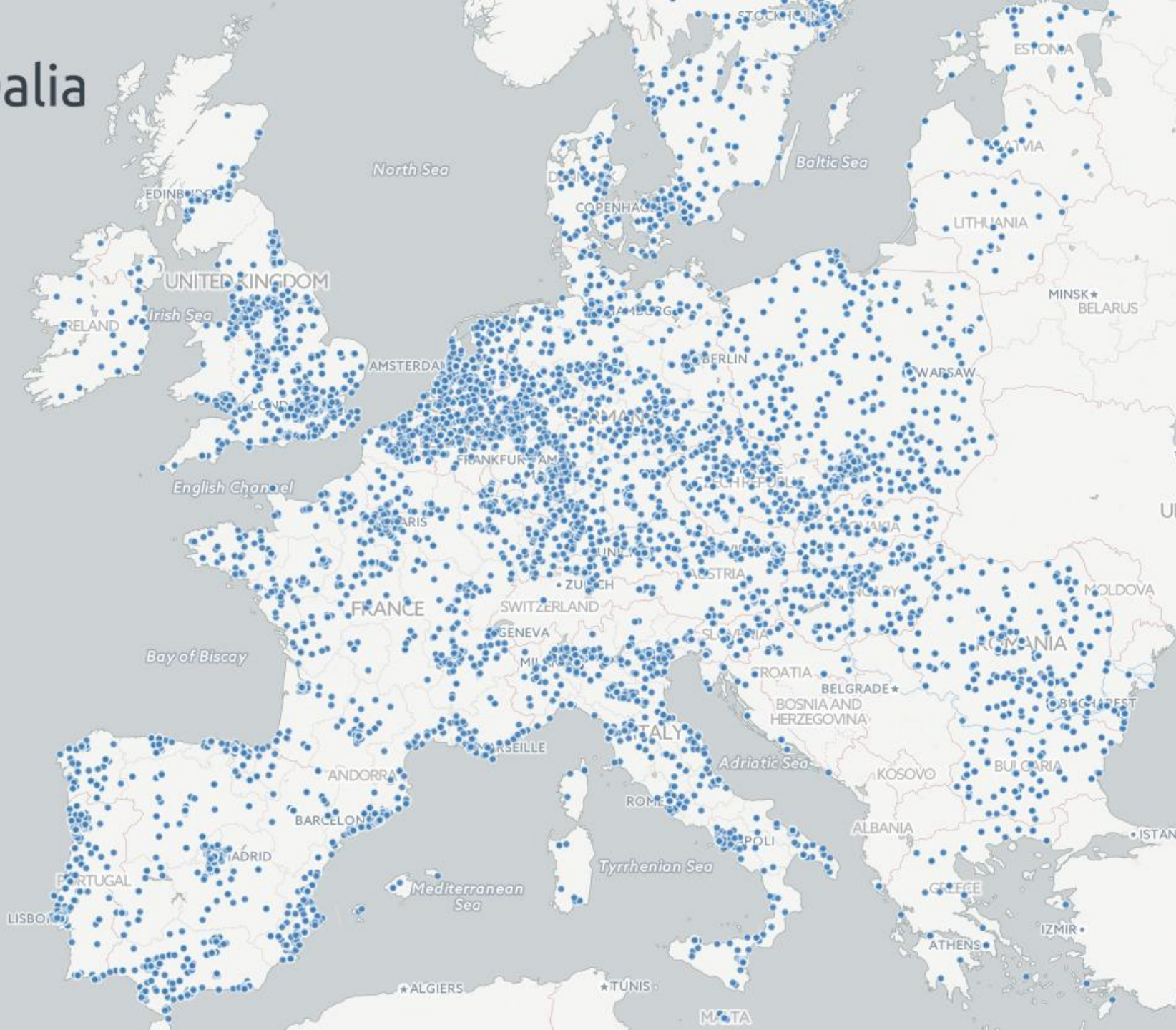


What do Europeans think about Basic Income?

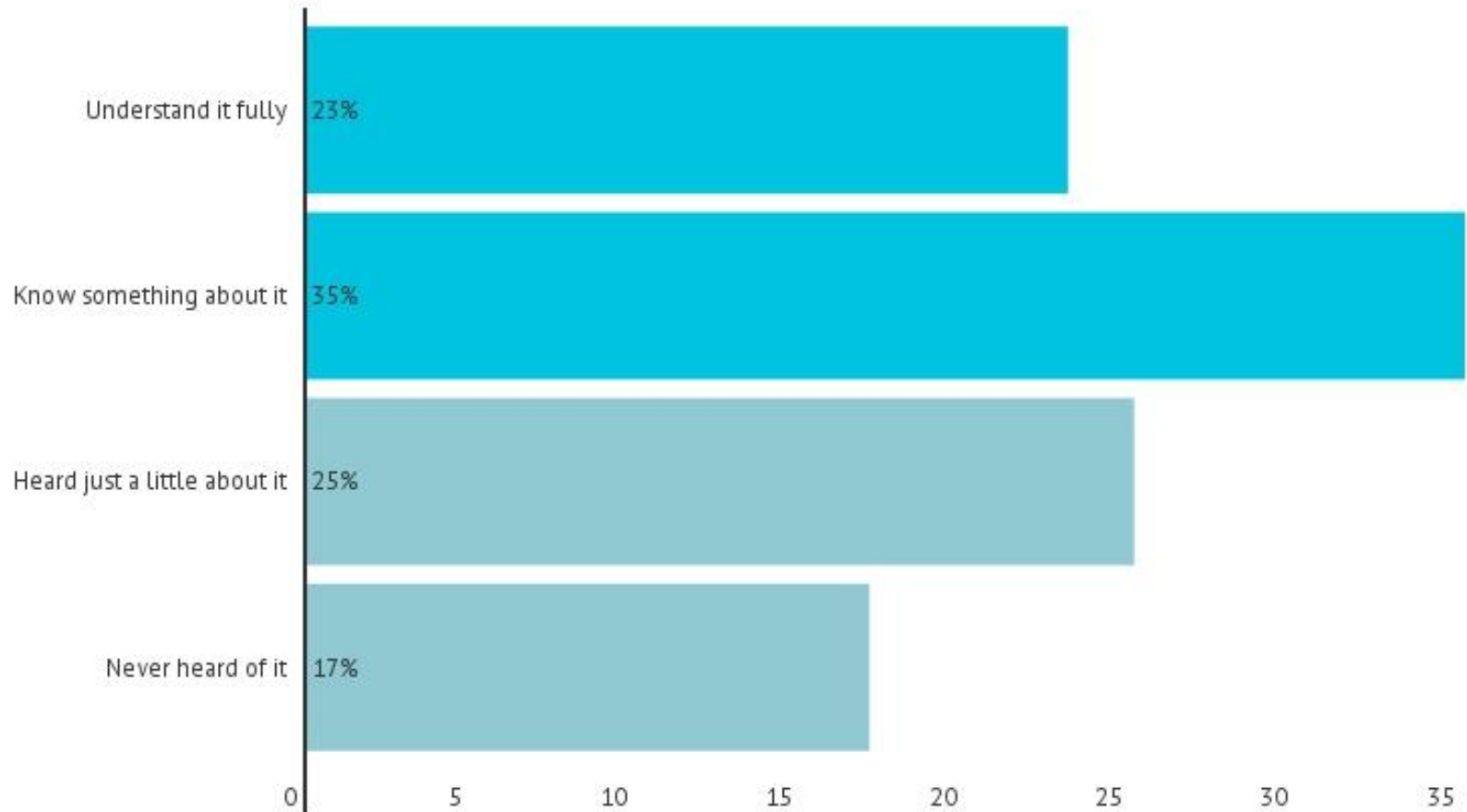

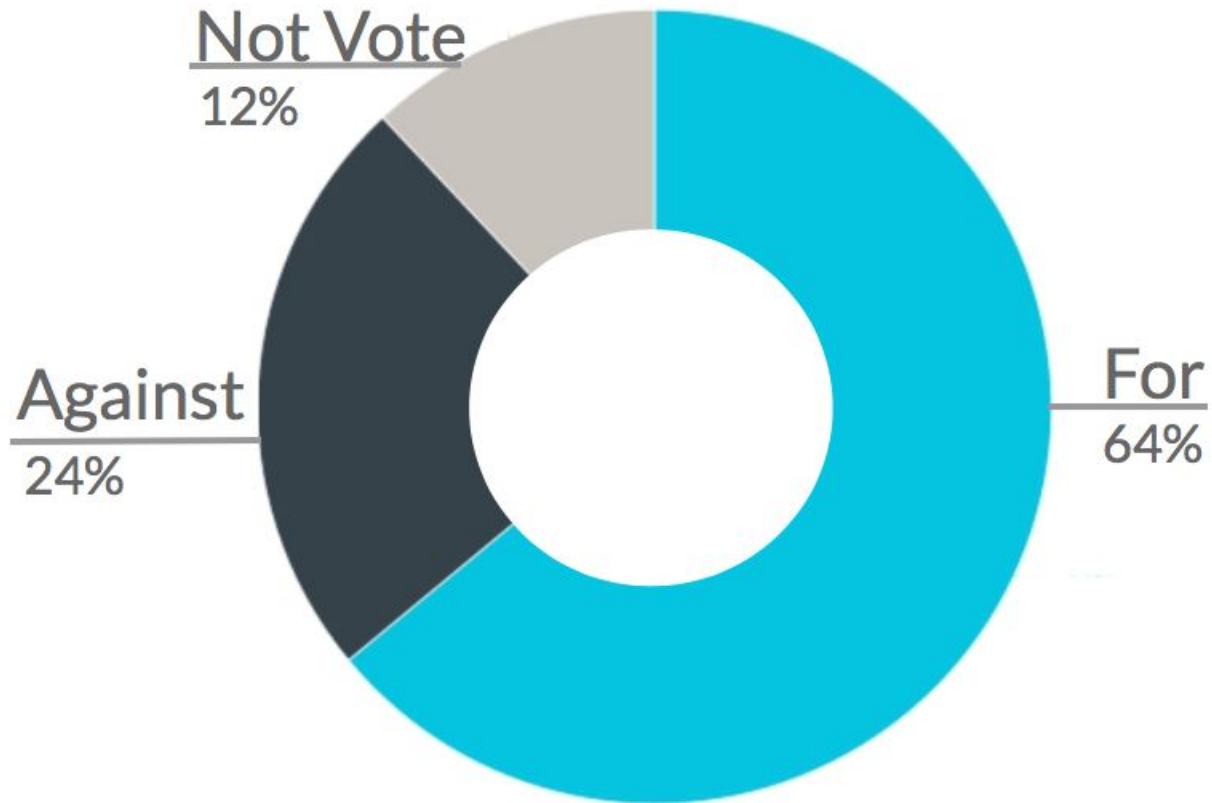
58% of Europeans familiar with concept of Basic Income



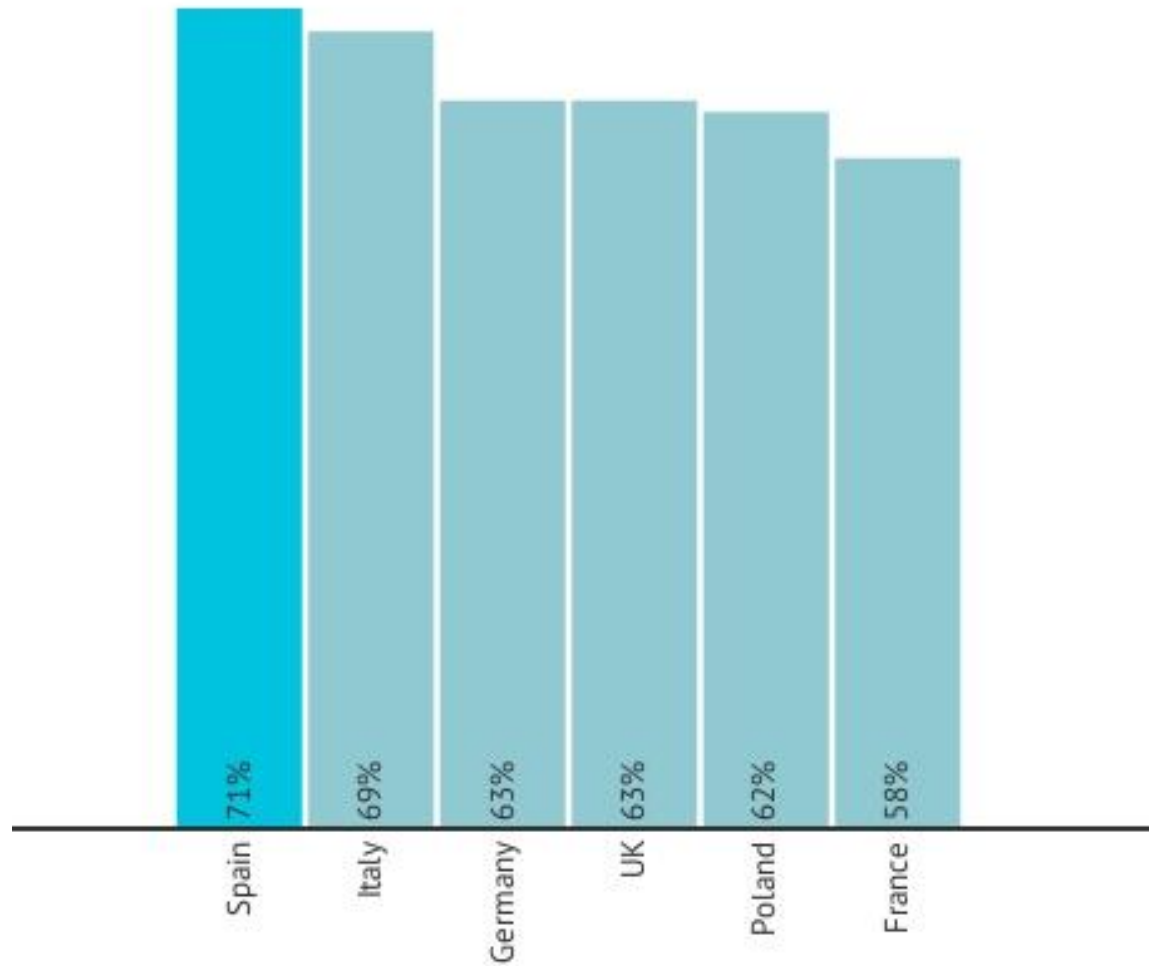
A basic income is an income **unconditionally paid** by the government to every individual **regardless of whether they work** and **irrespective of any other sources of income.** It replaces other social security payments and is high enough to cover all basic needs (food, housing etc.).



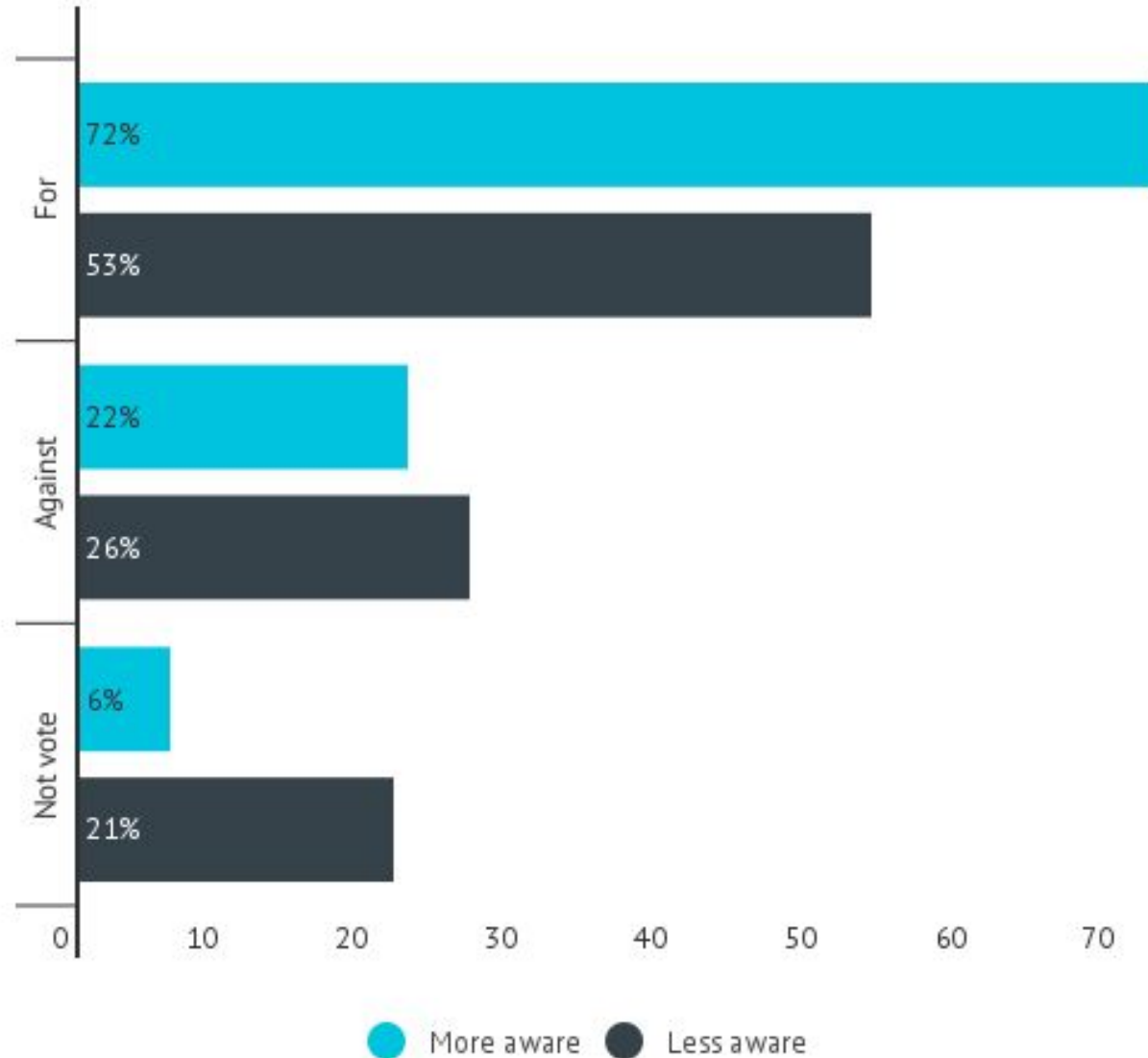
64% of Europeans would vote for Basic Income



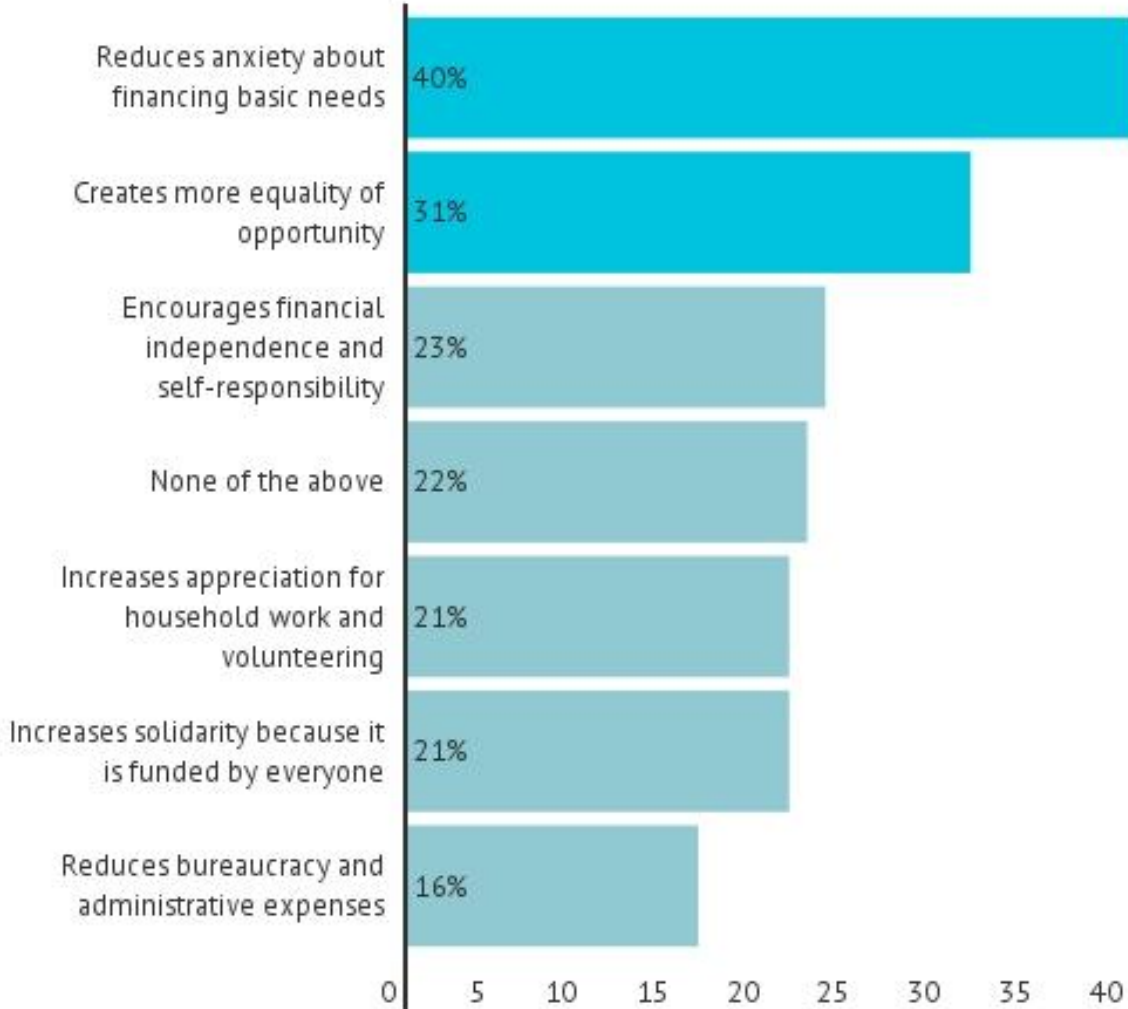
Support highest in Spain, lowest in France



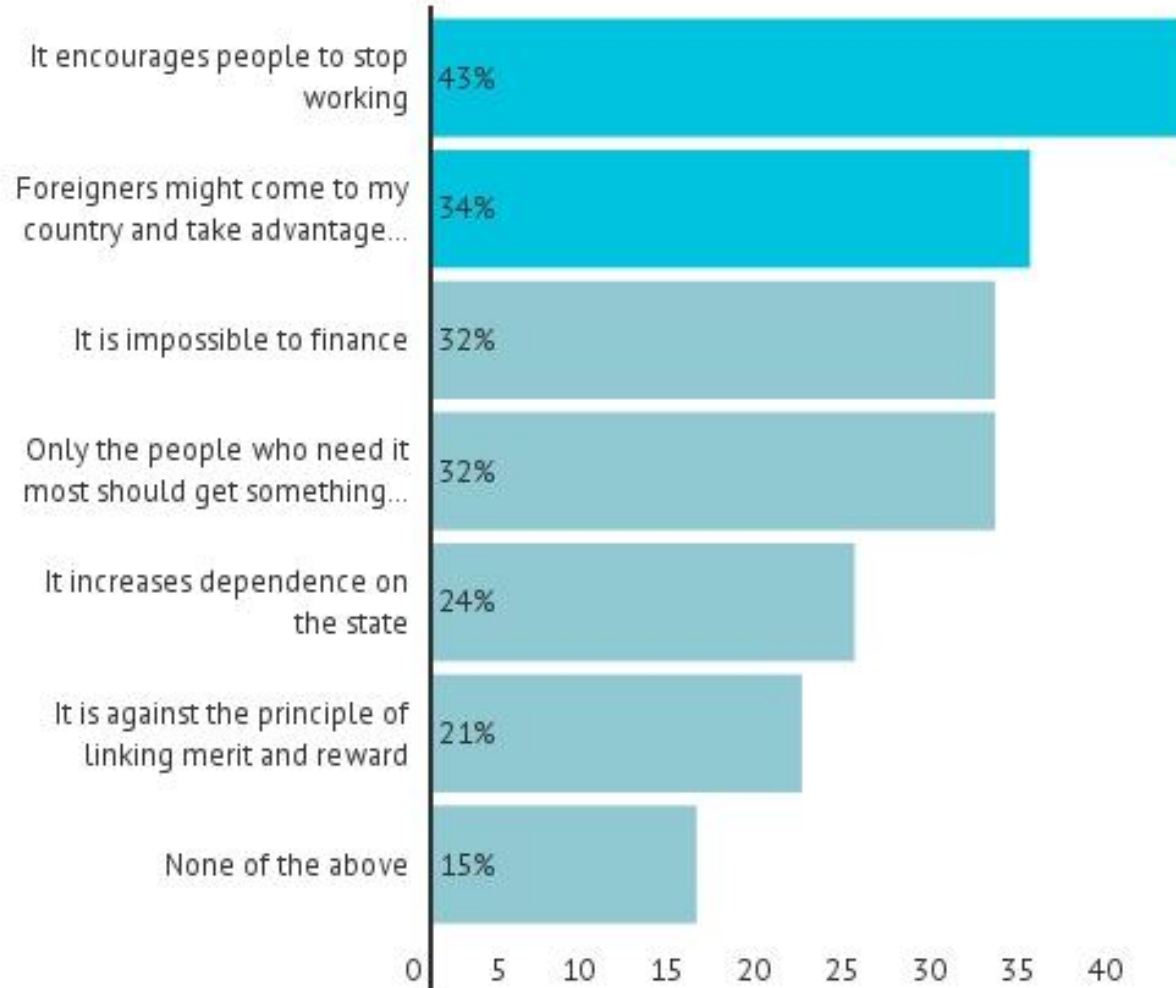
Awareness and support for Basic Income are linked



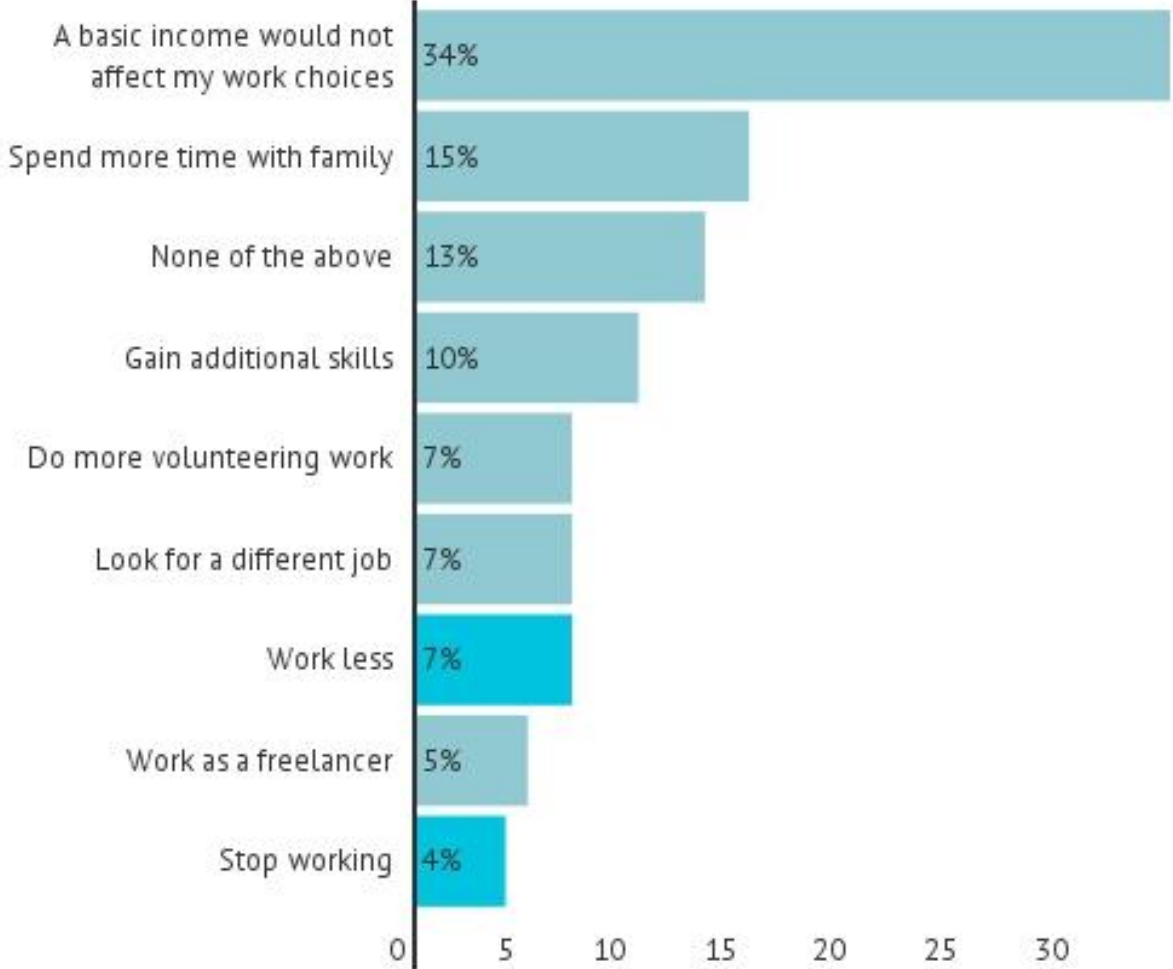
Biggest hope: less anxiety about financing basic needs



Biggest fear: people stop working



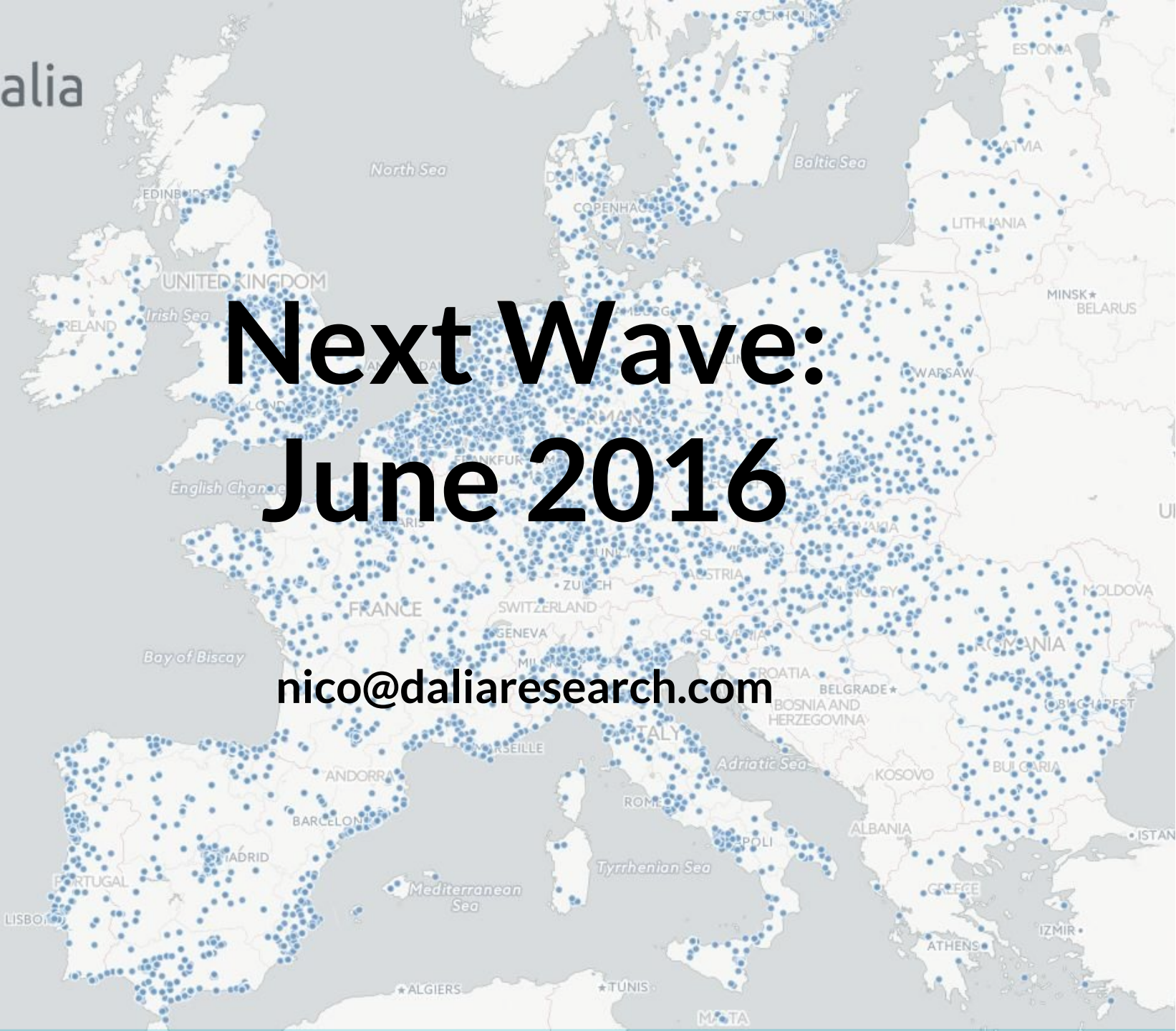
Most likely effect of BI: only 4% would stop working



Conclusions

- 58% familiar with concept of basic income
- 64% support basic income
- Awareness and support are linked
- Top hope: less financial anxiety, equality of opportunity
- Top fear: people stop working, foreigners take advantage
- Most likely effect on workchoices: only 4% would actually stop working
