



The rating agencies are evenly weighted when calculating the composite. It is calculated by taking the average of the existing ratings, rounded down to the lower rating in case the composite is between two ratings. A composite will not be generated if the bond is rated by only one of the four rating agencies. This composite is not intended to be a credit opinion. Credit quality does not remove market risk. Ratings apply to the credit worthiness of the issuers of the underlying securities and not the Fund or its shares. Ratings are subject to change.

- 12. The performance and risk factor comparisons are against the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index. Alpha is a measure of performance on a risk-adjusted basis. It takes the volatility (price risk) of a fund and compares its risk-adjusted performance to the Index. Any excess return of a fund relative to the return of the Index is a fund's alpha. Beta is a measure of the volatility of a fund relative to the Index. A beta greater than 1 is more volatile than the Index. R-Squared is a measure of how a fund's performance correlates with the Index's performance and it can help assess how likely it is that beta is statistically significant. Standard Deviation of return measures the amount of variation in historical performance from period to period.
