#### Flat Lay Photography Instructions

#### Instructions

- 1. Choose a space with a simple background, such as a wooden table or a plain countertop
- 2. Select clean dishes and cutlery that complement the background and one another
- 3. Find a place that has good natural lighting, or use artificial lighting that is soft and diffused, to avoid harsh colors and shadows
- 4. Utilize dynamic props such as such as utensils, decorative bowls, plants, flowers, or food ingredients
- 5. Photograph the dish as soon as possible to ensure it looks fresh


The following flat lay templates are simply to provide guidance and inspiration — so feel free to develop your own style!

If you'd like to print these out to use as an actual stencil, print in Tabloid or A3 size. Once you have everything in place, remove the paper stencil underneath before photographing.





## 6 tips for the perfect flat lay


- 1. Embrace geometry

- 6. Use editing and post-production tools





