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








Use the City Health Dashboard to...

- Compare health gaps across neighborhoods
- Compare your city to cities in other regions or with similar population
- Set priorities and better target resources

Data Dashboard/Visualization Best Practices

- Should data even be presented?
- Present the "bottom line" and just a few data points to support
- Address uncertainty directly
- Ensure usability in visualizations: boxes that highlight key points, upfront summaries
- Choose familiar data formats for your audience
- Minimize clutter, but use verbal qualifiers when helpful (low risk, most of the time...)
- Metaphors: equate numbers or rates to familiar things like seats in a stadium, # of people in your town, etc.





Data Dashboard Communication Goals

- Easily accessible to range of audiences
- Clear source and methods attribution
- Reflect public health priorities
- Amenable to city-level intervention
- Inspire action
- Layers of engagement to meet users where they are










Census Tract Values for Children in Poverty

Children in Poverty by Race/Ethnicity


Richmond, VA
