



Kick-start your knitting fundraiser

You can take on this challenge in whatever way works for you. The main thing is that you're raising funds to help life-saving research.

Here are some ideas to get you started:

Plan your knits

Whether you plan to knit a little every day or spend whole days working on your project, every stitch makes a difference.

Start your project

Choose what you're going to knit! You can use the pattern we've provided on page 7 or find your own one.

Make a festive gift

Why not give your finished item as a gift to someone this Christmas?

However you choose to take part, every stitch and every donation will help us beat cancer.

Please note: You're welcome to sell the items you make to raise funds, but please don't send them to Cancer Research UK as we can't accept them as donations.

How to knit for beginners

What you'll need

- Yarn (start with medium weight)
- Knitting needles
 (5–6mm is great for beginners)
- Scissors

Steps to start knitting

1. Make a slip knot:

- Start by making a loop in the yarn.
- Pull the yarn through the loop to form a knot and leave a tail around six inches long.
- Slide this knot onto one of your knitting needles. Pull gently to tighten.

2. Cast on:

- Hold the needle with the slip knot in your right hand.
- With your left hand, wrap the yarn around your left thumb.
- Insert the needle under the yarn on your thumb, and slide the loop onto the needle.
 Repeat until you have the number of stitches you want (try 10-20 stitches to start).

3. Knit stitch:

- Hold the needle with cast-on stitches in your left hand.
- Insert the right needle into the first stitch on the left needle from front to back.
- Wrap the yarn around the right needle (behind the work).
- Pull the yarn through the stitch, creating a loop on the right needle.
- Slide the original stitch off the left needle.

4. Continue knitting:

- Repeat the knit stitch for each stitch on the left needle until all stitches are on the right needle.
- Once all stitches are transferred to the right needle, switch the needles so that the stitches are in your left hand again.
- Continue knitting rows until you have the desired length.

5. Bind off:

- · Knit two stitches.
- Use the left needle to lift the first stitch over the second stitch and off the needle.
- Knit one more stitch and repeat, lifting the first stitch over the second until only one stitch remains.
- Cut the yarn, leaving a tail, and pull it through the last stitch to secure it.

6. Finish:

 Use the scissors to cut the yarn, and use the yarn tail to weave in any loose ends with your hands or a yarn needle.

You've made your first knitted piece! Keep practicing these steps to build your skills.

Top tips

If you're new to the world of knitting, here are some top tips to guide you through your fundraising challenge.

Knit with a friend

If you're starting out and not feeling too confident, why not invite a friend to join in? Knitting together can make it more fun and you can support each other if you run into any challenges.

Start out simple

If you can't get started on your DIY knitting project just yet, try a smaller, quick-knit project or a fun crafting activity to keep the festive spirit alive while you prepare for the main event.

Plan every stitch

Use the calendar in your pack to note down when and where you'll work on your knitting projects. This will help you stay on track and weave your way to success!

Get your friends and family involved and share pictures and videos of your knitting progress in our supportive <u>Facebook group</u>. Don't forget to celebrate and shout about every donation milestone too!

Why not auction your completed Christmas knits to friends and family and donate the proceeds to your online Giving Page?


Make a donation
