Whether you choose to fundraise at work or school, we've put together a few fun and easy ideas to suit you.

Do you have more than 3 months until your Relay?

You've got plenty of time to raise those all-important pounds. Why not push the boat out and host a large-scale fundraiser?

Share your skill

Hold a class or activity using your best skills. Teach your peers or colleagues how to cook or host an exercise class. Alternatively, you could provide the entertainment by putting together a concert featuring you and your friends. Raise money by selling tickets!

Pick a fun sporting event, whether it be the Euros, World Cup or Wimbledon. Or maybe you can start up a fantasy football league. Get everyone to donate to enter and pick a team. The winning team will receive a prize!

Whether it's football, golf, or an inflatable obstacle course, why not bring out the competitive streak in people while raising money? Spread the word and see if local businesses can help or donate a prize.

Seasonal carnival

Celebrating summer, Diwali or the festive season? There are so many ways to bring your community together. Set up fun stalls with games and treats and provide top entertainment. Attendees are guaranteed to have a fab time whilst helping you raise money for Relay For Life.

Quick wins

Karaoke night

What better way to raise money for world-leading research than belting out your favourite tune?

Car wash

By grabbing a bucket, a sponge and a few friends, you can easily organise a car wash in your community.

Games session

Host a games session with people from your community and ask them to donate the money they would have spent on a night out.

Fundraising ideas to challenge yourself

Why not take on a personal challenge and see how much you can raise individually?

Set the bar high

Do something out of your comfort zone to show how far you'd go to fundraise for Cancer Research UK. Sign yourself up to something extreme like a skydive or abseil and get your friends and family to sponsor you. Or, keep your feet on the ground but do something just as brave by performing in public for donations.

Get crafty

Have an eye for arts and crafts? Share your talent with friends and family by creating some masterpieces in return for a donation. Think seasonal and create personalised cards, summer holiday photo frames, Valentine's jewellery, homemade Hanukkah candles or even personalised school pencil cases.

Quick wins

Lend a helping hand

Have a knack for ironing or wrapping presents? See if you can get donations for offering up your skills to someone who might want those tasks taken off their hands.

Coins instead of a cake

Instead of your favourite treat, set aside the money you would spend for a month and add it to your fundraising. You'll be surprised how much your fundraising total can rise!


Waxit

Sometimes it's best to go back to basics. Getting waxed is a classic charity fundraising technique that's guaranteed to yield results. Your friends are always willing to pay to hear you shout 'ouch!'

Your money powers progress

Did you know?

If you set a target on your fundraising page, you could raise 46% more.



£190

could buy 600 Petri dishes, in which our scientists can grow and study cancer cells.





£220

could fund our team of nine cancer nurses for one hour. Our nurse helpline offers confidential support and quidance to people affected by cancer.



£1,000

could fund the Add-Aspirin trial for one day, which is investigating whether aspirin can stop cancer coming back after treatment.



£400

could pay for a mini centrifuge, which is used to spin blood samples until different types of blood cells separate. Our scientists can then study the different types of cells to find out more about them.



£2,500

could fund 2 weeks of a trial testing innovative radiotherapy techniques for treating rare bile duct cancer.



How to return your fundraising

Pay in through JustGiving

This is the easiest and quickest way to send in your raised funds. Collect all your hard-earned funds and add them to your events JustGiving fundraising page. Watch that fundraising total go up!

Through your Committee

Top tips for social media

Make sure you're benefiting from the power of social media. Follow these steps when promoting your fundraiser and share your Relay successes with friends and family.



- Remember to share a link to your online O1fundraising page whenever you're promoting your fundraiser.
- O2Shout about your fundraiser with people outside of your followers by using other popular hashtags eg #ThrowbackThursday, #GivingTuesday.
- 03Follow local groups, businesses and highprofile people in your community. If they follow you back, it might open up new opportunities to promote your fundraiser.
- ()4 If you're hosting a fundraising event, create an Eventbrite or Facebook event to invite all your friends and family.
- Always try to post using an image or video 05to catch people's attention. Why not wear your Relay t-shirt in all your selfies?

Elaine's story

Elaine was working in a Cancer Research UK shop in Edinburgh in 2016 when she was diagnosed with breast cancer. After surgery, chemotherapy and radiotherapy she's now eight years cancer free. She says: "I have been raising funds for Cancer Research UK since my brother died of cancer in 2007. My daughter Carrie also works for the charity. Together, we took part in Relay For Life Arbroath in 2019 - I was totally hooked." Elaine even became Dunbar Relay For Life Chair. Over two years, they raised over £130,000. She said: "It was incredible how the community pulled together and joined the fight. I find being together with other survivors is so special and powerful! We're creating more tomorrows."
