

EPRI: BORN IN A BLACKOUT

THE CREATION OF EPRI WAS FUELED FROM THE GREAT NORTHEAST BLACKOUT OF 1965.

WHAT CREATED THE BLACKOUT:

THE BLACKOUT WAS CAUSED BY A FAULTY RELAY SETTING AT SIR ADAM BECK STATION ON THE ONTARIO SIDE OF NIAGARA FALLS LEADING TO A POWER SWELL FROM THE SOUTH, CAUSING POWER OVERLOADS AND AUTOMATIC SYSTEM SHUTDOWNS IN NEW YORK, NEW JERSEY, CONNECTICUT, MASSACHUSETTS, RHODE ISLAND, NEW HAMPSHIRE, VERMONT AND PARTS OF CANADA.

Blackout knocks out power.

Electric Research Council creates Greenbook, a blueprint for 30 years of R&D.

Federal hearings held due to public criticism of utilities after the blackout. Utilities allowed one year to develop what is now EPRI or face proposed 1 percent tax on gross revenues for federally-funded organization.

EPRI officially incorporated.

Chauncey Starr officially begins at EPRI.


