**PSY 1100 and SOCA 101 are not required for students intending to major in Economics. All other programs within the College of Business and Economics require those two courses. Students pursuing a degree in Economics may choose other Social Science electives.

***Students are required to complete between 27-30 hours within the Business majors. Students will work with their advisor to distribute ELECTIVE credit to meet the 120 credit hour graduation requirement.

To be admitted to the College of Business and Economics, students must have an overall GPA of 2.5. Students must also complete the following College of Business and Economics prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of C or better:

- ECON 2200 & 2201
- ENGL 1100 & 2367
- MATH 1148 & 1131
- CSCI 1101
- STAT 1350
