Students who plan to continue at WVU-Morgantown will need to maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA in all PSYC classes and a 2.0 overall GPA. PSYC 241, 281, and 232 or 251 fulfill PSYC Clusters D-E in Morgantown.

^{**} Students must complete a minimum of twenty-one hours of science coursework in each of three disciplines to obtain a BS degree. There are six disciplines: biology, chemistry, computer science, geology/geography, math/statistics, and physics. Courses used to fulfill this requirement may be used simultaneously to satisfy GEF and or major requirements.
