Dear Friends,

Where are we headed? How will we get there? Now that most of us have GPS mapping on our phones or in our cars, practical directions to most destinations happen almost automatically. Just tap where you'd like to go and a route is prepared for you. If you make a wrong turn, a voice cries out in your car or in your pocket, "recalculating..." and suddenly a new route to your chosen destination is prescribed.

This orientation and reorientation does not happen automatically in our spiritual lives. Getting on track spiritually requires openness, discipline, sustained attention, prayer, determination and grace. As Christians, we call the work of orienting ourselves in a Godward direction repentance. The word itself may seem overwhelming or induce feelings of guilt, but it shouldn't. Repentance simply means to turn, to return, or to change one's mind. Lent offers us an extended opportunity to repent; to revisit where we have been and where we are headed as individuals in community. We are invited to turn or return more closely to the way of Jesus, the way of Love.

This Lent, I invite you to join fellow members of the cathedral community in discerning the path God is charting for you through the wilderness of life. In prayer, fellowship, study and service, our journey will take us all the way to the cross and then beyond it to Christ's glorious resurrection as we discover together where God is leading us.

SUNDAY SERVICE SCHEDULE

8:00AM Traditional Mass

The 8:00 service is a spoken Mass, using traditional language.

9:15AM Cathedral for Kids

A service for the young—and the young at heart! The Mass is engaging for smaller children and adults alike and offers teaching on themes that connect our prayer life to spiritual and social learning.

11:15AM Choral Mass

The 11:15 Choral Mass is a full cathedral service featuring choral music. The preaching relates the scriptures to our daily lives, and the music is carefully chosen to relate to the themes of the season.

4:00AM Choral Evensong

(usually the first Sunday of the month; check incarnationgc.org/music for dates)

Choral Evensong is a service in which the 'song' of choral voices is heard at the 'even' point between the active day and restful night, allowing listeners time for restful contemplation.

The Office of Tenebrae

Wednesday, April 17 at 7:30pm

The Cathedral Choirs perform the service of Tenebrae, a favorite of the cathedral community. In this solemn and beautiful liturgy, psalms are chanted and sung along with the lamentations of Jeremiah. Candles and other lights in the cathedral are gradually extinguished until a single candle, a symbol of our Lord, remains. The congregation exits in darkness and silence. Music for this service will be sung by the upper voices of the choir, including works by Pergolesi, Sumsion, Martin and Archer.

The evening Mass commemorates the Institution of the Holy Eucharist, and includes the Washing of Feet, recreating the action of the Lord the night before his crucifixion. Choral music will include works of Duruflé, Bruckner and Near.

What are you giving up for Lent? I'm hearing lots of talk about giving up sweets. I suppose sugar, most especially, is a good thing to give up for your health. But why do we need to give up anything? Oh, I hope that you've had your sackcloth cleaned, I understand it's what we'll be wearing on Ash Wednesday. Not to worry, we'll be providing the ashes.

I have to confess that quite like my New Year's resolutions, my Lenten 'give ups' end up causing me more guilt than they really should. Which makes me wonder why 'give up' at all? I have heard the alternative of giving up is to take on. But honestly whether you give up or take on, it's all about entering into the discipline of Lent. A discipline that invites us "by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word" (Book of Common Prayer p. 265), we might move beyond ourselves and deepen our relationship with God and with the people around us.

May this season of Lent be an opportunity for all of us to grow in our life of faith and as we celebrate the great feast of Easter may we live into the new life that has been promised to us.

As we move around the circle of the church year, we will be entering one of the most holy and sacred times in our faith lives. In the Lenten season, our cathedral will be draped in purple and we are reminded again that we need to make room for God. Sometimes we think about Lent as being about taking things away – often things we enjoy! But a more helpful way of thinking about Lent is spaciousness. This year we will learn together how to make space as families and as a community, allowing our practices to pare away what is not needed and reveal what is essential: God's love. Holding fast to God's love, we can weather the sorrows of Holy Week, and when the joy of Easter comes, we can celebrate together that God's love will never leave us, never fail us, and certainly never let us down.

Good news for LI-CAN

Governor Cuomo has outlined specific legislative proposals in his State of the State-in several areas, including:

- Elimination of prior authorization requirements by insurance companies for MAT.
- Funding for MAT for opioid users in correctional facilities.
- Requirements that hospitals make MAT (specifically buprenorphine) available for opioid users in their emergency departments.

These measures will reduce overdose deaths in New York State and help turn the tide against this epidemic, which has claimed the lives of thousands of people on Long Island.
