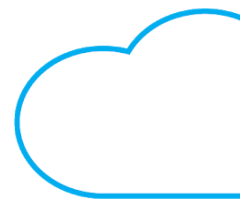

## FELLOWSHIP IN FAITH WITH KATE + ACTIVITIES FOR ALL AGES

May 31, 2020

Following Cathedral for Kids Online, we go directly into *Fellowship in Faith with Kate*. We'll have interactive crafts, activities, and check-ins...make sure you have a joke to share this week with us! This week, Activity One is better for school age children and require some adult assistance. Activity Two is good for children of all ages!

### Activity One: Holy Spirit Wind Chimes

When the Holy Spirit descends on the disciples, our story describes it as a powerful wind! If you want to imagine what the wind of the Spirit can sound like, try making these simple wind chimes. #### **Materials Needed**

- At least three tin cans (washed and dried) - the more cans you have, the more sound your chimes will make!
- Drill
- Hammer
- Washers (optional)
- Fine grit sandpaper (optional)
- String
- Paint that can stick to metal (acrylic usually works well)
- Clothes hanger



### ***How to Make It***

1. Wash and dry your tin cans.
2. Have a grown-up hammer down any sharp edges around the opening of your can (these can be sharp!).
3. A grown-up can also help you drill a small hole in the bottom of your can. This is where you will thread your string to hang the can.
4. If you have sandpaper, sand the can all the way around the outside. This will help your paint stick to the metal.
5. Paint your can. You can use any colors, or you could try using red, yellow, and orange to give a fire appearance for Pentecost!
6. Let your paint dry in the sun - the heat from the sun will help the paint attach to the can.
7. Once your cans are dry, you can thread string through the hole in the bottom of each can. Tie a knot in the end of your string to keep the string from falling through the hole. This is where you may want to use a washer to help keep the knot secure on the hole.
8. Tie the opposite end of the string to your hanger.
9. Each can will need its own string. Try cutting the strings to slightly different lengths. You need them to be close enough in length that the cans touch, but different enough to give a variety of sound and appearance.
10. Hang outdoors and listen to the sounds when the wind blows! Imagine if the wind can make all this noise, what can the Holy Spirit do!

## **Activity Two: Happy Birthday Church!**

### ***Materials Needed***

- Party decorations
- Birthday cake or other fun treat!

### ***How to Play***

1. Pentecost is the day God made the Church. Celebrate this feast day with a special birthday party for the Church!
2. Bake a cake or make your own party hats.
3. Gather your family and share your favorite church memories and things you're looking forward to in the future.
4. Make it special for Pentecost by decorating with wind and fire theme decorations.
5. Celebrate by sharing with each other what is special about church for you!
