THE NICENE CREED

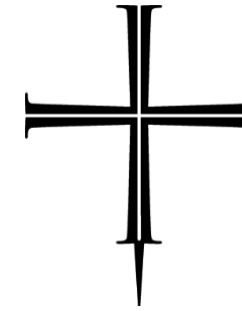
