Greetings from the Cathedral Close!

Advent is a rich time of anticipation and wonder as we begin a new year as a community of faith.

During this season, we pause quietly each Sunday to light a candle and remember that light conquers despair. The light grows brighter and brighter each week until it spills out in resounding hymns of unfettered joy and praise at Christmas. This sacred time of preparation puts us in touch with our core values as Christians. Love of neighbor. Justice. Mercy. Compassion. Peace.

As the candles of Advent flicker before our eyes, we invite the light of Christ to find a central place in our hearts and minds. We prepare like Mary to give birth to something new. We pray that our actions might embody Christ in a broken world. We sing O come, O come, Emmanuel as we anticipate hearing again the message of the angels.

The Cathedral of the Incarnation is a place to join with the saints and angels in proclaiming that this is good news even if it scares us. The child coming into the world has the power to heal the deepest hurts and bridge the greatest divides. The child coming into our lives this Christmas offers to change us for good even when we resist our own healing. If you find yourself terrified by the changes and chances of the world in this season, you are not alone. The whole community is here to support you as we journey together toward Bethlehem. God is with us.

May this season be filled with hope and love as we prepare to welcome Jesus once more. A child is born and a new adventure begins. Come, let us adore him. Be not afraid. Rejoice!

SUNDAY SERVICE SCHEDULE

8:00AM Traditional Mass

The 8:00 service is a spoken Mass, using traditional language.

9:15AM Cathedral for Kids

A service for the young—and the young at heart! The Mass is engaging for smaller children and adults alike and offers teaching on themes that connect our prayer life to spiritual and social learning.

11:15AM Choral Mass

The 11:15 Choral Mass is a full cathedral service featuring choral music. The preaching relates the scriptures to our daily lives, and the music is carefully chosen to relate to the themes of the season.

4:00AM Choral Evensong

(usually the first Sunday of the month; check incarnationgc.org/music for dates)

Choral Evensong is a service in which the ‘song’ of choral voices is heard at the ‘even’ point between the active day and restful night, allowing listeners time for restful contemplation.

The Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany seasons are rich in music, and the repertoire the choirs will sing reflect our usual wide range of musical styles, including both old favorites and works new to us. The choristers and teens have several favorites they request each season...and given the time they spend here in December, we're more than happy to oblige them!

Since it would take a lot of space to describe everything the choirs will sing, I'd like to focus on a few works. Two pieces from the Renaissance era, "*Gaudate*" and "*In dulci jubilo*" will return, in addition to several pieces written in the past decades. We will add a new work this season by one of Slovakia's leading composers, Vladimír Godár, which will also feature our newly-restored Steinway piano. Finally, my study of the choral music of Ukraine inspired the inclusion of a carol from that wonderful tradition.

Both the choral music and the hymns we sing for the Advent and Christmas season work together to prepare us for the celebration of the Birth of Christ, using the great body of texts and tunes which has come down to us through the ages.

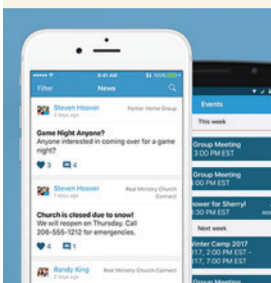
