

#### Jesus dies on the Cross


When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son!" Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And when Jesus had received the vinegar, he said, "It is finished!" And then, crying with a loud voice, he said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." And he bowed his head and handed over his spirit.

# Liturgy of the Word:

(All sit) A Reading from the Book of Jeremiah (31:31-34)

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.


#### Psalm 51:1-13

## The Gospel

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John (12:20-33)

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

"Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

#### All sit for: The Homily

A period of silence follows the homily. Then the celebrant invites all to stand and says

Let us affirm our faith in Jesus Christ the Son of God.

Though he was divine, he did not cling to equality with God, but made himself nothing. Taking the form of a slave, he was born in human likeness. He humbled himself and was obedient to death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God has raised him on high, and given him the name above every name: that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, and every voice proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.

# Prayers of the People

With confidence and trust let us pray to the Lord.

For the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, for Michael, our Presiding bishop, Lawrence, our bishop and all who minister in your Church. Lord of compassion, in your mercy hear us.

# Liturgy of the Table

The Celebrant bids an Offertory Sentence. The people sit. We offer the fruit of our life and labor as the table is prepared. Then all stand to sing

#### And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.

#### We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

#### It is right to give him thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth You bid your faithful people cleanse their hearts, and prepare with joy for the Paschal feast; that, fervent in prayer and in works of mercy, and renewed by your Word and Sacraments, they may come to the fullness of grace which you have prepared for those who love you. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



We praise you, O God, Savior of the World. For you made all humankind in your own image, to rule your creation in peace, and commanded us to live together in love forever. When our first parents disobeyed you, turned away and hid their faces from you, you sought them in the cool of the evening. Though they wandered far away from the tree of life you gave them, you never ceased to search for us, their children.

With the same steadfast love, you led your people Israel out of slavery; and when they deserted you and worshipped false gods - still you did not forsake them. You gave them your law to guide them, and you led them through the desert to a new land of promise.

In due time, you sent your Son himself to seek out the lost and bring them the good news of your boundless mercy. He did not keep himself to the company of the righteous; he chose sinners for his friends; and laying before them your gift of forgiveness, he died for them on the tree of the cross, showing the fullness of love.

Then you raised him from the dead and poured out your spirit on humankind. When he opened again the gates of paradise, Adam and Eve rejoiced as he pulled them from the grave. Now he shares his victory with those who rejected him. Now we sinners, too, rejoice to give thanks for the death and risen life of your Son; and in the power of his spirit, we have turned from our errors to follow his example and share his saving life in the breaking of bread.

For on the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it and gave it to his disciples and said, "Take, eat: This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, Eternal God, from all the things that are yours, we offer you these, which are yours especially. We offer them gladly, as he told us, giving thanks for his death and resurrection. And, seeing that the power of sin is broken, and Christ is all in all, we praise you, and we bless you.

We praise you, we bless you, we give thanks to you, and we pray to you, Lord our God.

Now send your sanctifying spirit to show us that this bread and this cup are the body and blood of your Son, and every sin is pardoned, and every debt is redeemed, and you have made us your holy people. And in union with the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Holy Mother of God; and all your saints, bring us at last to his kingdom of peace.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.** 

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

## **Breaking of the Bread**

The celebrant breaks the consecrated bread.

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

The congregation receives communion. During communion the Cantor sings:

My song is love unknown, my Savior's love to me;
Love to the loveless shown, that they might lovely be.

O who am I, that for my sake, my Lord should take Frail flesh, and die?

Here might I stay and sing, no story so divine;

Never was love, dear King, never was grief like Thine.

This is my Friend, in whose sweet praise, I all my days could gladly spend.
