

Dean's Forum: I Sing a Song of the Saints of God Sunday's at 10:15am, Feb. 27 to April 3 In person at the Mercer Library

The Saints of the Christian tradition have furnished us with a great diversity of spiritual examples and teachings. From martyrs to mystics, from teachers to hermits, activists to scholars, they form a kind of "course" in Christian living. This Lent we will look at a few of these brave souls as examples to us of lives by which we might be inspired to deeper adventures in Christian living. There will be a short presentation on the saints(s) of the day, followed by time for discussion, reminiscence, and reflection. We begin on Sunday, February 27, the last Sunday before Lent, old Quinquagesima Sunday, reflecting on Saints Proclaiming Freedom, Trevor Huddleston, C.R. and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. This forum will be introduced by Rita Ann and Canon Bruce Griffith. Subsequent sessions will look to all members of our clergy staff and others to guide us in our contemplations of many diverse saints from Our Lady to Rev. Dr. M. L. King Jr., Polycarp to John Henry Newman, the mystic Gregory of Nyssa to Dorothy Day, and more. Come and find yourself in the company of the saints.

Fellowship in Faith for Families


Sundays 10:00am to 11:00am

Altar Guild

The altar guild is a group of women and men, organized in rotating committees, who are responsible for setting up the daily and Sunday communion services throughout the year. Vergers Guild

The vergers of the cathedral are lay ministers who assist the clergy in the planning and execution of cathedral and diocesan liturgies, as well as other events held on the cathedral close. Vergers are, in a sense, the shepherds of the liturgy when they marshal processions and physically lead other lay ministers, such as lectors and oblation bearers, to their appointed assignments. Verges also work with the ushers and tour guides to provide a welcoming, safe, and prayerful environment for the conduct of our public worship together.
